Any open judge positions will be nominated by FIG. Freestyle: 6 judges (3 per Difficulty and 3 per Execution) will judge, including one Difficulty judge who is also acting as CJP. One reserve judge should be planned. Difficulty judges are nominated and invited by the FIG. Execution judges are drawn from the participating federations on-site and attend at the expense of their NF.
