# General Information

## I.General Information

### 1. Introduction to the 19th Asian Games Hangzhou 2022

Date: 23 September to 8 October 2023

Host City: Hangzhou

Co-host Cities: Ningbo, Wenzhou, Shaoxing, Jinhua, Huzhou

Sports: 40 sports, 61 disciplines

Venues: 54 competition venues, 31 training venues

Positioning: New Era, Great Asian Games

Guidelines: Streamlined, Safe, Splendid

Concept: Green, Smart, Economical, Ethical

#### 1.1 Emblem



“Tides Surging” is the official name of the Emblem. It represents the Qiantang River in Hangzhou, one of three largest river tidal bores in the world.

#### 1.2 Mascots



The three mascots of Hangzhou 2022 are Congcong, Chenchen, and Lianlian. They represent the three World Heritage Sites that are located in Hangzhou - the Archaeological Ruins of Liangzhu City, the Beijing-Hangzhou Grand Canal and the West Lake.

#### 1.3 Asian Games Village

The Asian Games Village has three main zones, the Athletes Village (AV), Technical Officials Village (TOV) and Media Village (MEV). The Asian Games Village covers a total land area of 113 hectares and has a total built area of approximately 2.41 million square metres, There are 108 buildings on the site. Moreover, there are two (2) Athletes Sub-villages (hotels) located in Chun'an County and Tonglu County in Hangzhou, and three (3) Athletes Sub-villages (hotels) located in Jinhua, Xiangshan County in Ningbo, and Wenzhou.

#### 1.4 Other Information

## 2. Accreditation and Validation

The 19th Asian Games Hangzhou 2022 Organising Committee (HAGOC) will send the updated Accreditation Guide to responsible organisations in November 2022. Online accreditation will be available from 20 December 2022 to 20 May 2023.

From 20 July 2023 onwards, HAGOC will issue and mail out Pre-valid Hangzhou Asian Games Identity and Accreditation Cards (HAGIACs) to responsible organisations that have confirmed their Accreditation Status Reports. Upon their arrival in Hangzhou, Games participants will be required to validate their Pre-valid HAGIACs, at any Games accreditation facility, by presenting their valid identity documents. Once validated, the HAGIACs will permit access to venues, sites and zones required for the Games participant to perform his or her duties. HAGIAC card holders will have access to the venues, and areas in venues requiring accreditation, indicated on their cards.

## 3. Validity Period of HAGIACs

Non-Chinese nationals will be permitted multiple entries into and exits out of the Chinese Mainland from 00:00 on 24 August 2023 to 24:00 on 23 October 2023 (TBC) upon presentation of their valid passports or other international travel documents, and HAGIACs issued by HAGOC.

## 4. Transport

Athletes and team officials will be provided with transport on arrival and when departing and for competitions, training and competition spectating. Services will be available from 9 September to 11 October 2023. HAGOC will allocate a specific number of dedicated vehicles (with drivers) to each NOC delegation for its exclusive use. Please refer to the *Detailed Transport Services Plan for the 19th Asian Games Hangzhou 2022* for more details.

## 5. Accommodation

During Hangzhou 2022, NOC athletes and team officials will stay in the Athletes Village or Athletes Sub-villages. The Athletes Village has 37 apartment buildings with a total of 2,600 apartments that will be able to accommodate more than 10,000 athletes and team officials. The Athletes Village will officially open on 16 September 2023 and close on 11 October 2023. For security, access to the different zones in the villages will require the appropriate accreditation card.

## 6. Media Services

### 6.1 Mixed Zone

Athletes must pass through the mixed zone at the end of a competition, so that they can be interviewed by accredited media as soon as possible after the competition ends. Although athletes must pass through the mixed zone after a competition, they are not obliged to comply with any request to be interviewed.

After a Victory Ceremony, athletes and teams who have won medals must pass through the mixed zone and allow themselves to be interviewed by accredited media (if necessary).

### 6.2 Press Conference Room

After the final of each event, in principle, a post-competition press conference will be arranged. A press conference will also be arranged after each competition in team events including in Football, Basketball and Volleyball.

At press conferences, consecutive interpreting will be provided. Translating a participant's native language into English, if needed, should be done by the Press Attach é (s) of the relevant NOC taking part.

### 6.3 FOP Photo Positions

FOP photo positions will be set up in FOPs or FOP surrounding areas in each competition venue. These positions are for accredited photographers to use to take photos of competitions. Accredited photographers will need to wear supplementary access control devices in order to enter FOP photo positions. For some events, the shooting at the FOP photo positions may use photo truck(s), photo boat(s), catwalk remote control camera(s), shooting house(s), and underwater remote control camera(s).

## 7. Medical Services

Medical rooms (medical stations) will be set up and ambulances available at competition and training venues. During the opening periods of venues, professional medical staff will provide Games participants with basic medical services, first aid and patient referrals, where needed.

The Polyclinic, which will be set up in the Athletes Village, will have nine (9) clinical departments including Emergency and Internal Medicine, Emergency Surgery, Orthopaedics, Gynaecology, Ophthalmology, Stomatology, ENT, Acupuncture and Massage, and Rehabilitation Medicine. It will also have five (5) medical laboratories and facilities including a Pharmacy, Ultrasound Lab, ECG Room, Radiology Department and a Clinical laboratory. Professional medical staff will provide basic medical services, first aid and patient referral services to Games participants where needed, 24 hours a day. Basic medical, on-site emergency and patient referral services will be provided free of charge. Other medical services shall be paid for in accordance with the provisions stated in the relevant insurance cover policy. Other costs incurred shall be paid for by the individual receiving treatment.

People suffering from chronic diseases should go to Hangzhou 2022 designated hospitals for medical treatment. Diagnosis and treatment of chronic diseases will not be available in medical rooms at venues or in residential zones.

## 8. Weather Information

### 8.1 Climate in Hangzhou

Located north of China's southeastern coast, Hangzhou enjoys a subtropical monsoon climate. Over the past 30 years (1991-2020), Hangzhou has recorded an average temperature of 17.5 °C, an average relative humidity of 73.6%, an average annual precipitation of 1491.8mm, and an average of 1642.4 hours of sunshine annually. The average temperature in September is 24.6 °C, the average wind speed is 2.1m/s, and average monthly precipitation is 113.3mm. The average temperature in October is 19.3°C, the average wind speed is 1.9m/s, and average precipitation is 74.1mm monthly. Following is detailed weather information for Hangzhou in September and October over the past 30 years.

## II. Technical Information

### 1. Competition Date

The Rhythmic Gymnastics competition of the 19th Asian Games Hangzhou 2022 will be held from 6 to 7 October 2023 at Huanglong Sports Centre Gymnasium.

### 2. Competition Venue

The Rhythmic Gymnastics competition will be held at Huanglong Sports Centre Gymnasium, with a seating capacity of 6,081. The annex hall of the Gymnasium will be used for warm-up. The venue is 15.5 kilometres away from the Athletes Village.

Zhejiang College of Sports Gymnastics Hall will be used for training. It's 7.1 kilometres away from the Athletes Village.

## 6. Competition Rules

The Rhythmic Gymnastics competition of Hangzhou 2022 will be conducted in accordance with the technical and competition rules and Code of Points of the Federation Internationale de Gymnastique (FIG) in force during Games-time. In case of any disagreement in the interpretation of the FIG rules and regulations, the English version of technical and competition rules and code of points shall prevail.

Detailed competition information is available on the website of the FIG: [www.gymnastics.sport](http://www.gymnastics.sport).

Any unforeseen circumstances not covered by the regulations and rules and code of points shall be resolved as follows:

- Technical issues: Resolved in accordance with FIG rules and regulations;
- General issues: Resolved in accordance with the OCA Constitution and Rules.

## 7. Competition Format

### 7.1 Individual Team Final and Individual All-around Preliminary (Qualification)

No more than 4 gymnasts per federation compete in this competition, presenting 12 exercises according to FIG regulations in the order fixed by the FIG. Each gymnast must present at least 1 exercise but no more than 4. Each apparatus will be performed by 3 different athletes in 3 exercises, a total of 12 exercises.

The team result and ranking will be calculated by adding all the best 10 notes of the team's gymnasts. If a NF participates with only 1 gymnast, she must present an exercise with all 4 apparatus. She can qualify for the All-Around Final.

The 3 best exercises will count for the qualification for the All-Around Final. After this competition, the 24 best gymnasts (max. 2 per NF) are qualified for the All-Around Final.

The 24 top gymnasts from the All-Around ranking (qualifications - 3 best apparatus) will advance to the All-Around Final.

Sub-group B (gymnasts ranked 24-13 from the qualification) start, followed by sub-group A (gymnasts ranked 12-1 from the qualification).

## 7.2 Individual All-around Final

The final ranking will be determined by the total scores of 4 routines with hoop, ball, clubs and ribbon. Scores of the qualification round will not carry over to the final round.

## 7.3 Ranking and Awards

### Individual Team Final

The ranking will be determined based on the results of Individual Team Final. The athlete with a higher score will rank higher. If there is a tie, the ranking will be determined according to the tie-breaking rules of FIG.

### Individual All-around Final

The ranking will be determined based on the results of Individual All-around Final. The athlete with a higher score will rank higher. If there is a tie, the ranking will be determined according to the tie-breaking regulations of FIG.

## 7.4 Gymnasts' Drawing of Lots

The draw will decide the order in which the lot for each team or gymnast will perform and determine the order in which the team and gymnast to compete in the competition.

All delegations will be informed of the drawing results.

Based on the Definitive Registrations the gymnasts' drawing of lots for the Qualifications and the Finals has been conducted Monday 7 August 2023 at 15:00 at the AGU Headquarters in Doha (QATAR) in the virtual presence of RG TC President Gyoza Filippova.

The procedures will be published and the results will be published consecutively. As per FIG TR Section 1 Art. 4.1, after the draw, no gymnast can be added to the number of gymnast(s) declared in the Definitive Registration. No additional individual gymnasts may appear at the accreditation.

## 8. Sport Entries

### 8.1 Eligibility

Only NOCs that are members of the OCA are entitled to send athletes to compete in the Rhythmic Gymnastics competition of Hangzhou 2022.

Only athletes who comply with the OCA Constitution and Rules and its By-laws are entitled to compete in the Rhythmic Gymnastics competition.

Age Limitation: Gymnasts must be at or above the age of 16 (born on or before 31 December 2007).

All gymnasts must present a valid FIG License until the end of the Rhythmic Gymnastics competition of Hangzhou 2022.

### 8.2 Entry Timeline

Entry by Sport -Deadline: 24:00 20 February 2021 (Beijing Time, GMT +8)

Entry by Number -Deadline: 24:00 15 March 2023 (Beijing Time, GMT +8)

Entry by Name - Deadline: 24:00 15 July 2023 (Beijing Time, GMT +8)

### 8.3 Entry Policies

Individual: Each NOC may enter two (2) athletes per individual event.

Team: Each NOC may enter one (1) team, including three (3) or four (4) athletes.

Total: Each NOC may enter a maximum of four (4) athletes.

Any NOC that withdraws its athletes or teams after the submission of the final entries by name or the Team Draw phase will be faced with disciplinary action by the OCA Executive Board.

## 9. Technical Officials and Jury of Inquiry

### 9.1 Technical Officials

The President of the Superior Jury must be appointed by the AGU.

The Superior Juries will be formed by the Technical Committee Member.

The AGU RG TC President is the President of both Superior Juries.

National Technical Officials shall be appointed by the CGA.

AF or IF has the right to appoint the President of the Superior Jury and ITOs in coordination and approval of the OCA. In the event of any violation of the AF or IF Rules or Games Rules and Regulations by any participant, the OCA has the right to revoke his or her accreditation card and propose replacement of the participant concerned to the relevant party.

### 9.2 Accompanying Judges

Each NOC may appoint one (1) qualified judge. All appointed judges must have a valid FIG brevet category for their function.

Judges should have Category I, II, or minimum Cat – III.

### 9.3 Judges Drawing

The Judge from different matches will be drawing at the pre-game's technical meeting.

## 11. Inquiries

Inquiries shall be handled as per latest FIG competition regulations. All inquiries of a technical nature will be the responsibilities of FIG or AGU.

The content, time limit, object and procedure of inquiry must be strictly in accordance with the provisions of the FIG Technical Regulations.

NOC's may only file inquiries against D score of each gymnast, otherwise inquiries will be rejected. Specific procedure goes as follows in accordance with the FIG Technical Regulations:

- Inquiries shall be made verbally immediately after the publication of the score or at the very latest before the score of the following gymnast is shown.
- In terms of the last gymnast of a rotation, this limit is one (1) minute after the score is shown on the score board. The person designated to receive the

verbal inquiry has to note the time of receiving it and starts the procedure.

-Only accredited coaches, in the competition area, are entitled to submit inquiries.

-Late verbal inquiries will be rejected. A NOC's not allowed to complain against a gymnast of another NOC.

-Inquiries for all other scores (Execution, Artistic) are not allowed.

-The inquiry must be confirmed in writing within four (4) minutes after the verbal inquiry is made. (CHF 300 is required for the first complaint, CHF 500 for the second, and CHF 1,000 for the third and subsequent complaint lodged by the NOC throughout the event (and not starting from "1" again at each competition phase)". The fee will be paid by the team leader upon signature for confirmation. And the fee will be transferred to HAGOC.

Should the inquiry not be confirmed in writing within four (4) minutes, the procedure becomes obsolete. The D-score is divided into two sub-groups - Difficulty Body (DB) and Difficulty Apparatus (DA), each sub-groups is considered as a distinct score and must be challenged separately (either DB and DA or only DB or DA). Thus, if DB and DA of the same routine are challenged, the coach has to submit two inquiries with the respective forms. DB will be considered as first inquiry, DA as second inquiry.

- After review of the inquiry, should the final score be higher, this sum will not be invoiced. However, should the final score remain unchanged or be lowered, the sum will be invoiced.

-Each inquiry will be verified by the Superior Jury, and a final decision (which may not be inquired) must be made:

- By the end of the rotation in the Qualification and Final.
- Before the score of the following gymnast is shown for the Final.

-Inquiries shall not be accepted if they do not meet the above-listed criteria.

-Decisions made by the Jury of Inquiry will be final.

Any athlete or NOC may inquiry to the Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS), in the event that the athlete or NOC believes that there has been a violation of FIG or AGU technical rules or the OCA Constitution, as long as the inquiry is not related to reversing the decision of the judge or result.

## 12. Equipment and Clothing

### 12.1 Equipment

All equipment used in the competition will be checked in accordance with the requirements of the FIG.

### 12.2 Control of Hand Apparatus and Competition Attire

The list of the hand apparatus with valid certificates is published on the FIG website and updated regularly. Make sure that your gymnasts participating in Hangzhou Asian Games use only FIG certified hand apparatus for this event and for any other FIG recognized competitions.

At the same time, the competition leotards will be checked by the RG Athletes' Representative to be sure they are in compliance with the requirements stated in the 2022-2024 Code of Points and the Competition Clothing and Advertising Rules.

Gymnasts will also have the possibility to have a preliminary check during training sessions.

Further checks on the hand apparatuses and the leotards may take place at the end of the competition exercise at the request of the Superior Jury.

Clothing worn by athletes and other relevant participants in competition must comply with the rules and regulations of the OCA and FIG. Neither athletes nor technical officials will be permitted to attach any form of commercial advertising

to his or her competition uniform without prior approval of the OCA and HAGOC.

### 13. Doping Control

In order to ensure healthy and fair competitions and protect the interests of the athletes, the Anti-doping programme of Hangzhou 2022 will be conducted in strict accordance with the *World Anti-doping Code* and the *OCA Anti-doping Rules*.

### 14. Victory Ceremony

Gold, silver and bronze medals will be awarded to the athletes ranked the top three of each individual event respectively. In each team event, gold, silver and bronze medals will be awarded to each of the team members in the top three teams, respectively.

The Victory Ceremony will start immediately after the competition ends. Before the Victory Ceremony starts, the medalists shall be escorted to the Waiting Area to get ready for the ceremony.

Medalists must wear their NOC official uniforms.

### 15. Sport Information Centre (SIC)

All sport-specific information for Rhythmic Gymnastics will be available at the sport information desks. They will be located at the competition venue and the SIC in the Athletes Village.
