1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 Welcome to Santiago 2023

The Pan American and Parapan American games are a sports festival, with a world-class organization that allows athletes from the Americas to reach excellence. The celebration will unfold Santiago de Chile's natural beauty, dynamism, and multicultural energy.

1.2 Santiago as a city

Santiago, the capital city of Chile, was founded 482 years ago, on February 12th, 1541. It is located in the central part of the country; its landscape is complemented in the background by the Andes Mountain range. With Mediterranean weather, it rains only in winter, and at 570 meters (1870 ft) above sea level, the city offers the ideal conditions for high-performance athletes.

By 2023, the Santiago Metro will have a layout of 149 kilometers (93 mi) in length, with 143 stations that will go through 28 districts. It will be the second largest subway network in Latin America, and it will connect the Pan American Village (Cerrillos station) with the Estadio Nacional in just 12 minutes. Every official venue in Santiago connects to a subway station or is a short bus ride away.

With a population of 6.1 million, Santiago is the largest city in Chile and the sixth in South America.

The currency that we use in Chile is the Chilean peso (CLP). You can also use US American dollars (USD) and euros (EUR).

Spanish is the de facto and administrative language of Chile. A 9.9% of the population speaks and understands the languages of the indigenous people, including Mapudungun is spoken by around a hundred thousand to two hundred thousand people, Aymara by about twenty thousand, Quechua by around eight thousand people and Rapanui by around three thousand and three hundred people.

1.3 The city as the host of large sports events

Chile has hosted several sports events and international sports meetings over the past few years. The Dakar Rally, during the 2009 and 2015 editions, along with the 2014 South American Games, are some of the examples that show that the country is ready to host world-class events. This is how the country makes its infrastructure and security available.

Hosting the XIX Pan American Games and the VII Parapan American Games in 2023 is of great importance for a city and a country that seeks to celebrate the sports spirit in the Americas, and that aims to leave a legacy of social transformation that promotes an active lifestyle and inspires the society and future generations. In Santiago, we are getting ready to welcome 6,916 Pan American athletes that come from 41 countries, who will compete in 39 sports and 60 disciplines. On the other hand, the Parapan American Games expect the visit from 1,927 athletes from 33 countries, in 17 sports and 18 disciplines.

As mentioned above, Chile was part of the official tour of the Dakar Rally in seven editions, between 2009 and 2015. On the occasion, more than three thousand vehicles competed in the national territory.

Santiago, together with five sub-venues, organized the 2014 South American Games. In this competition, 4,300 athletes, together with 3,000 volunteers and 400 thousand spectators, participated.

In 2015 the U-17 football World Cup was held in eight cities nationwide. Twenty-four delegations participated and traveled 63,500 kilometers (39,457 miles) throughout Chile. Another football event of continental relevance was the organization of the 2015 Copa América, also developed in eight cities with over 650 thousand spectators, more than 3,600 media professionals, and over 24 thousand accreditations were considered.

In 2017, Santiago was the location of the South American Youth Games (organized by ODESUR). This event gathered 1,200 athletes from 14 countries, who performed in 21 different disciplines in 18 venues within the city.

Our country has experience hosting large sports events. The World Rugby Under 20 Championship (2019), the Water Ski World Cup (2013), the Polo World Cup (2015), Junior Field Hockey World Cup (2016), the Roller Hockey World Cup (2016), the Bolivarian Beach Games (2016), the Pro Tour Table Tennis (2016), and the South American Volleyball Championship (2017), highlight the enthusiasm Chile has put into the organization and execution of sports events of international relevance.

1.4 Santiago 2023

Chile will be the host of the Parapan American Games for the first time in its history.

1.5 Fiu, the official mascot

Fiu is a Seven-colored tanager bird and was chosen to represent Chile at the Pan American and Parapan American games. *Fiu* is the sound of its singing. It lives in the wetlands of Chile throughout its territory. Even though it's a small bird, it always gives its biggest effort like all athletes who look for new challenges every day. Its seven colors mean strength, perseverance, respect, determination, honesty, fellowship, and passion.

Fiu's colors, in addition to the values mentioned above, represent the diversity of human beings and species: all races, languages, and beliefs from everyone who will participate at Santiago 2023.

Almost 50 thousand people gave their preference to choose the Official Mascot of the Games, an impressive record because it surpassed the participation at Guadalajara 2011, Toronto 2015 and Lima 2019.

At first, we received several interesting proposals, but we made a pre-selection of five mascots to vote for: Fiu, Pewü, Chitama, Juanchi, and Santi. Every single one had great stories behind them, which were available to all citizens to vote during August of 2021 on the website www.santiago2023.org.

2. COMPETITION

The female and male Artistic Gymnastics competition of the Santiago 2023 XIX Pan American Games will be held from October 21st to the 25th, 2023 at the Centro de Deportes Colectivos, Estadio Nacional, located at 2001 Grecia Avenue, Ñuñoa District, Metropolitan Region in Santiago de Chile.

Gold, silver and bronze medals will be awarded for every event of the artistic gymnastics competitions at the XIX Santiago 2023 XIX Pan American Games.

2.2 Competition format

2.2.1 Teams finals and qualification for the general individual final and apparatus finals.

Every NOCs qualified for teams can participate with a team of three to five gymnasts. A sixth gymnast won't be allowed.

Each team will be able to have a maximum of four gymnasts competing on each apparatus (it must be notified which gymnast won't compete in it). The three highest scores of each equipment will be added to define the total punctuation of the team.

This competition phase determines the champions per team and the qualification for the general individual final and the apparatus final.

Teams competition:

In case of a tie in the teams result, the ranking will be determined as follows:

1. The team with the highest sum of scores from the equipment team will prevail (scores that count), that is to say, the total sum of the 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 equipments with the highest team scores for male and the total sum of the 3, 2, 1 equipment with the highest team scores for females.

If the tie persists, there won't be a tie-break.

General individual qualification

The gymnasts that compete on every apparatus (six male and four female) will be able opt for a qualification for the general individual final, according to the FIG regulations.

For the General individual final the 24 gymnasts that have the individual highest scores will qualify, maximum 2 per country.

In case of a tie in the score for any position on the general individual qualification to qualify for the general individual final, the ranking will be determined in function of the following criteria:

1. The gymnast that obtains the highest final score sum obtained in apparatus (that is to say, adding the scores 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 of the highest scores for male apparatus and the scores 3, 2, 1 of the highest scores for female apparatus total of the five highest scores in the qualification for males, and the three highest on the qualification for females).
2. If the tie continues, the gymnast with the highest sum of E scores in all apparatus will prevail.
3. If the tie continues, the gymnast with the highest sum of D scores in all apparatus will prevail.

If the tie still persists, there will be no tie-break and there will be a draw between the gymnasts with the same ranking to determine the order to go to the general individual final.

Apparatus finals qualification

For the apparatus finals the eight gymnasts with the highest score on each apparatus will qualify, maximum two per country. In case of a tie on the qualification, the tie-break system in current the technical regulations of the FIG will be applied.

Vault events

Two different group vaults are necessary (and a different second flying phase is different for the GAF) to qualify for the vaults finals (according to the 2022/2024 punctuation code of the FIG). The qualification score will be the measurement of two scores.

For the team group results and the general individual competition, only the first vault will count.

Copyrights

Although Santiago 2023 guarantees the respect for copyrights and the distribution of musical works, each NOC is responsible for verifying that the music of its athletes does not infringe any copyrights and that it can be freely distributed in the media. We recommend responsible use of musical works and the prior authorization from their authors and/or from the copyright institutions of their countries.

Each NOC must inform about the duration, composer, artist, and title of the song to be used for each exercise. Together with the music form, the NOC must send by e-mail to the LOC the song (therrera@ext.santiago2023.org copied to info@upag-pagu.org).

2.2.2 General Individual Competition Finals

This phase of the competition determines the champions of the general individual final.

This competition consists of six exercises for male gymnasts and four for female gymnasts, according to the regulations of the FIG. The total sum of scores from the six exercises for males and four for females will determine the winners.

The results of the qualification competition won't be transferable for the general individual final. That is to say, the scores will start from zero. In case of a tie in any place on the qualification or on the finals, the tie-break system of the FIG will apply. (Same system used in the qualifying competition for the general individual results).

2.2.3 Apparatus finals

The competition consists of the apparatus finals, to determine the medalists.

The eight gymnasts that obtain the highest score on each apparatus on the qualification competition, maximum 2 per country, will compete on the respective final and execute an exercise.

The results of the qualification competition won't be transferable to the apparatus finals. That is to say, the scores will start from zero. The final results will determine the winner of each apparatus.

In case of a tie on any position, qualification or finals, the tie-break system of the FIG will apply.

2.3 Competition schedule

The competition will be held in five days for the female and male gender.

2.4 Training schedule and venue

The training venue will be the Centro de Deportes Colectivos of the Parque Estadio Nacional.

The training venue will be available from October 16 at 15:00 hrs., they will be distributed into two days with turns with an assigned length of time and coordinated between the participating countries.

The access to the competition and training area is allowed only for the competitors, coaches and authorized personnel.

The access to the competition and training area is only allowed for competitors, coaches and authorized staff, according to the FIG accreditation rules.

2.5 Qualification system

2.5.1 Quotas

The quota is 122 athletes.

(*) countries with qualified athletes from Junior Pan American Games Cali 2021 can have 1 individual place in addition to the maximum quota per gender on which they have athletes qualified in Cali.

2.5.2 Athlete eligibility

Athletes must have signed and submitted the Athlete Eligibility Condition Form and should have a FIG License that is valid until the end of the event.

Male Artistic Gymnastics athletes must be eighteen (18) years of age or older in 2023. 18 years old athletes who compete as Juniors in 2023 are not eligible.

Female Artistic Gymnastics athletes must be sixteen (16) years of age or older in 2023.

2.5.3 Cali 2021 quotas

The following athletes were the gold medalist who qualified directly at the Cali 2021 Junior Pan American Games for the Santiago 2023 Pan American Games:

In case that the qualified gymnast is part of one of the participating teams in Santiago 2023 or if the athlete who obtained the place cannot participate in the Santiago 2023 Pan American Games, said place will be lost and may not be transferred to a country or to any other athlete who finished in another place in the Cali 2021 Junior Pan American Games.

The athletes who qualified at the Cali 2021 Junior Pan American Games will not be able to obtain another individual place for their NOC; however, another athlete may compete for another place through the Santiago 2023 qualification system within the maximum quota per NOC.

2.5.4 Qualification System

Qualification for the Pan American Games is based on the results of the Senior Pan American Championship that will be held in May 2023 (results of the Qualification Competition).

In the event of a tie in the qualification, the tiebreaker rules set forth in Article 7.1.1 and 7.1.2 of Section 2 of the FIG Technical Regulations shall apply.

The places obtained are for the country, not for the athlete, except for the places granted in the Cali 2021 Junior Pan American Games, which are for the athletes mentioned in the previous section.

In case that the 7 individual places (54 - 60) cannot be completed with gymnasts from countries other than those already qualified (less than 20 countries participating in the 2023 Senior Pan American Championship), the places will be redistributed to the 10, 11, 12 and 13 qualified teams, successively adding an individual gymnast to each of them.

The host NOC must compete in the qualifying event in the respective discipline (WAG and MAG 2023 Senior Pan American Championships) to receive its allocated places.

2.5.5 Confirmation of quota places

The PAGU will confirm to Panam Sports and to the NOCs the places that have qualified no later than June 15th, 2023.

The NOCs must confirm to Panam Sports and PAGU the places they will use no later than June 22nd, 2023.

2.5.6 Reallocation of unused quota places

An order of priority to reallocate the quotas that could be left unused after the NOCs have confirmed their participation has been determined:

1. If a country withdraws its full team (1-9), the team qualification order will be followed to appoint a full new team.
2. In case that a country with a full qualified team withdraws 3 or more gymnasts, it will become part of the group of countries with individual qualification and may only participate with a maximum of 2 gymnasts. The full team quota will be allocated to the next qualified team.
3. If a country with individual qualification withdraws (Teams 10-13) its two gymnasts, the team qualification order will be followed to appoint a new country with individual qualification.
4. Any other unused quota will be allocated as follows:
 - a. Individual gymnasts (maximum one per country) until all the countries that participated in the 2023 Senior Pan American Championship are completed.
 - b. A third gymnast to the countries qualified 10 - 13.
 - c. A fourth gymnast to the country qualified 10.

- d. A fifth gymnast to the country qualified 10.
- e. A fourth gymnast to the country qualified 11 and so on.

NOTE: In any other unexpected case, the corresponding TC will make the decision with the approval of the PAGU.

If necessary, the Pan American Gymnastics Union will confirm the reallocation of unused quota places no later than June 26th, 2023.

The NOCs that receive reallocated places must confirm their participation no later than June 30th, 2023.

Additional observations

The maximum number of persons that a NOC may officially register is the following:

- Gymnasts: According to qualification
- Coaches: A maximum of 3 (countries with full team) / 1 (countries with individual gymnasts)
Maximum 1 for the gymnast qualified in Cali 2021 only in case his/her country qualifies a Team and he/she is not part of it, or if he/she is the third individual gymnast of his/her country.
- Judges: A maximum of 3 depending on the number of qualified athletes and the FIG Category
Additionally, the Members of the PAGU Technical Committees
The final number of judges per country may be adjusted depending on the availability and FIG Categories.
- Head of delegation: A maximum of 1 (same for WAG and MAG)

All Federations qualified by team have the right to participate with a team of 3-5 gymnasts. A sixth alternate gymnast is not allowed.

The team must be composed of no more than 4 gymnasts competing in each apparatus and the 3 best scores of each apparatus will be considered for the team's total.

2.6 Qualification Paris 2024 Olympic Games

In Artistic Gymnastics, the best positioned athletes in the Individual All Around Final Competition (WAG or MAG respectively) who have not yet qualified for the Paris 2024 Olympic Games with other criteria will obtain direct qualification. (See Criteria 7 of the FIG Qualification System for Olympic Games Paris 2024).

2.7 Rules, protests and appeals

2.7.1 Rules

The rules for the artistic gymnastics competition must follow the requirements detailed on the valid documents for the 2022/2024 cycle and that will be in force during the games.

These are:

- The technical regulations of the International Gymnastics Federation (FIG).
- Norms for the use of apparatus 2023.

- The FIG punctuation code, newsletter, technical regulations and advertising rules available at <http://www.gymnastics.sport/site/rules/rules.php>
- Panam Sports regulations, information about the actual cycle of rhythmic gymnastics and according to the technical regulations of the Pan American Gymnastics Union (UPAG) and the standards from Panam Sports.

2.7.2 Protests

Only complaints about the difficulty grade will be admitted and they will be solved according to the FIG and UPAG regulations. The superior jury will decide about the complaints based on the FIG and UPAG technical regulations.

2.7.3 Jury of appeals

The jury of appeals will be constituted by two representatives of the UPAG executive committee (one of them will work as president) and a third member. During the competition, no member can take part in the decisions of the main jury.

The main jury will be constituted by the FIG technical delegate, the UPAG technical delegate and the UPAG executive committee member.

2.7.4 Superior jury

The superior jury will be constituted by the technical delegate of the FIG, the technical delegate of the UPAG and the members of the UPAG technical committee.

2.7.5 Use of brands in sports equipment and clothing

The competition and non-competition uniforms, and sports equipment for the Santiago 2023 Pan American Games will need to follow the requirements in the Panam Sports' "Games Uniform and Sport Equipment Guidelines", which complies with the requirements of the International Federations of each sport.

August 17th -20th	Guidelines distributed to the NOCs and the Chefs de Mission by Panam Sports with a link to the Extranet. Specific sections of sports distributed to the Federations by Panam Sports.
August 16th - December 15 th	The NOCs will send uniform proposals to Panam Sports for their approval.
December 15th	Deadline for the approvals from Panam Sports.

January - April	Approvals remaining by Panam Sports: The approvals must be made with a minimum of 6 weeks before the clothing production or the equipment purchase.
