



In the year of the Olympic Games, teams can be composed of any combination of Juniors and Seniors, with no restriction on the number of Seniors i.e. can be up to six (6) Juniors or up to six (6) Seniors or any mix of both. • Team results from combined Junior and Senior scores. • FIG Qualification Competition Rules. • Each country identifies the five (5) athletes whose scores could count for the team. Best 4 scores of the 5 count. This can be different for each event. - The Pacific Rim Senior Group competition will be held in the year of the Olympic Games as long as a minimum of 3 Groups participate.
- Junior Group competition will not be offered as this is only held in the year of the Youth Olympic Games.

 - 5 Hoops
 - 3 Ribbons/2 Balls

- Combined Scores of 2 routines

Apparatus Finals:

- Top eight (8) Groups in each event will advance to finals.

- FIG Team qualification rules.
- A team comprises a minimum of three (3) and a maximum of four (4) gymnasts per event (men's or women's competition).
- In an Olympic year, a team can be composed of any combination of Juniors and Seniors, with no restriction on the number of Seniors i.e. can be up to four (4) Juniors or up to four (4) Seniors or any mix of both.
- Q1 acts as qualification for Team Finals.
- The sum of the three (3) highest scores obtained by the team members in *each* round of qualification one (Q1) will give the overall team score (sum of six (6)) after qualification.
- There are separate Team awards for men and women.
