2. SUMMARY OF EYOF 2025 IN SKOPJE

The 2025 European Youth Summer Olympic Festival (EYOF) is scheduled to take place from 20 to 26 July 2025 in Skopje, North Macedonia. This marks the first time North Macedonia will host this prestigious multi-sport event for young athletes aged 14 to 18 from across Europe.



The festival will feature more than 4,000 participants from 50 European delegations, competing in 15 sports disciplines. While Skopje will serve as the main host city, some events will also be held in the nearby city of Kumanovo, and in Osijek, Croatia, where Artistic Gymnastics will be held.

2.5. Destination Information

SKOPJE is the capital city of North Macedonia. It's the largest city in the country with a population of approximately 616,000 people. Skopje began as a settlement called Scupi which was then part of the Roman Empire. It was at an important crossroads on a Roman road which connected the Adriatic Sea with Byzantium. Skopje is a very attractive tourist destination with its archaeological sites, cultural and historical monuments and natural landscape. Here are some of the best places to visit:

MATKA CANYON is located 15km south-west of Skopje and covers an area of roughly 5,000 hectares. It is home to several medieval buildings and monasteries in addition to dozens of caves and a large number of endemic plants and animals. It is one of the most popular destinations in North Macedonia and it offers its visitors the opportunity to engage in a range of activities such as alpine hiking, kayaking on the Treska River and visiting the cave.



THE OLD BAZAAR (in Macedonian: Стара Чаршија, Stara Charshija) in Skopje is the largest bazaar in the Balkans outside Istanbul. It is situated on the eastern bank of the Vardar River, stretching from the Stone Bridge to the Bit-Pazar and from the Skopje Fortress to the Serava River. Evidence exists of the existence of a merchant quarter on the bazaar's territory in the 12th century. During Ottoman rule, the Bazaar became the city's merchant center and home to around 30 mosques, and other Ottoman buildings and monuments. Most of those buildings were transformed into museums and



galleries. The Museum of the Skopje Old Bazaar, situated in Suli Han, includes collections of artifacts that evidence the life within the bazaar, its development, and the crafts that were practiced during its history. Nowadays the modern bazaar includes several mosques, türbes, two churches and a clocktower, in addition to the buildings of the Museum of North Macedonia and the Museum of Modern Art.



THE MILLENNIUM CROSS is a 66 meter-high cross built on the highest point of the Vodno Mountain in Skopje to serve as a memorial of 2,000 years of Christianity in North Macedonia and the world. A chairlift was constructed to aid transfer of visitors to the region of the cross where a panoramic view of the city of Skopje can be seen. At night the cross shines down over the city.

MEMORIAL HOUSE OF MOTHER TERESA is a landmark located in the City Centre and is a modern representation of the house of Mother Teresa who was born in Skopje in 1910. She spent her early years in this place where once



stood the Sacred Heart of Jesus, a Roman Catholic church where she was baptized. It cherishes and glorifies her life work, generosity, perseverance and dedication and is filled with relics of her time such as her birth certificate issued in 1928, her sari, handwritten prayer book, the rosary and cross as well as several awards she won throughout her life.

THE STONE BRIDGE on the river Vardar connects Macedonia Square on the right bank and the Old Skopje Bazaar on the left bank of the river. There are two different opinions about its existence. According to the first, it was built in the 6th century, shortly after the catastrophic earthquake in 518, during the reign of Emperor Justinian I. Others believe that the bridge was built in the second half of the fifteenth century, between 1451 and 1469, the time when the Ottoman empire was ruled by the Sultan Mehmed II the Conqueror.



THE FORTRESS KALE is located on the eponymous hill, in the very center of Skopje, on the left bank of the river Vardar and partly in the western part of the bazaar.

KUMANOVO is the third largest town in North Macedonia. Kumanovo is on the east-west crossroad in North Macedonia. The major road from Serbia to Greece and from Bulgaria to Albania passes near Kumanovo. The Skopje International Airport is 17 km from Kumanovo. Besides the cultural landmark, Kumanovo has one of the best Ethno villages, Resort Timchevski and Visiana.



KOKINO is a megalithic observatory located just 35km from Kumanovo. As previously mentioned, NASA recognizes it as being one of the 15 ancient observatories together with Abu Simbel in Egypt, Stonehenge in the UK, Machu Picchu in Peru, and others.

Osijek-Baranja County – The Heart of Slavonia and Baranja

Osijek-Baranja County, nestled in the northeast of Croatia where the Drava and Danube rivers meet, is a region of untouched nature, rich cultural heritage, and deep historical roots. Far from the crowds of the coast, this part of Croatia offers a different kind of beauty — one woven into golden fields, wide rivers, and charming towns full of soul.

Here, time moves a little slower, allowing visitors to truly connect with the land and its people. From the baroque elegance of Osijek to the traditional wine cellars of Baranja, every corner tells a story. Explore ancient Roman sites, Austro-Hungarian architecture, and remnants of medieval fortresses that stand as silent witnesses to centuries past.

Nature lovers will be drawn to the untouched wetlands of Kopački Rit, one of Europe's most important nature reserves, where rare birds and wild deer roam freely. The region's culinary scene reflects its diversity — with hearty stews, river fish specialties, hand-crafted wines, and the unmistakable flavor of Baranja kulen.

Osijek-Baranja County is a place where tradition is still alive, where festivals, folklore, and the warmth of hospitality turn every visit into a personal story. Whether you're cycling along the Danube, tasting local delicacies, or simply enjoying the peace of the plains, this region offers a genuine Croatian experience — rich, heartfelt, and unforgettable.



Osijek – The Soul of Eastern Croatia

Situated on the banks of the Drava River, Osijek is the cultural and economic center of eastern Croatia — a city where history, nature, and tradition blend into a unique urban experience. Known for its baroque architecture, peaceful river promenades, and warm hospitality, Osijek offers an authentic and relaxed atmosphere far from the busy tourist trails.



The city's rich history is visible at every turn. From the majestic Tvrđa — one of the best-preserved baroque fortress complexes in Europe — to elegant 19th-century buildings and art nouveau facades, Osijek tells the story of centuries past with quiet dignity. Walking its cobbled streets, you'll discover a city shaped by Roman roots, Ottoman influences, and Austro-Hungarian refinement.

Osijek is also a city of parks, bike trails, and riverfront cafes. Whether you're enjoying a sunset along the Drava, cycling through its green avenues, or exploring nearby nature parks, the city offers both tranquility and activity. Just a short distance away lies Kopački Rit, a vast wetland teeming with wildlife — perfect for nature lovers and photographers.

The local cuisine reflects the best of Slavonian flavors: spicy fish stew (*fiš paprikaš*), slow-cooked meat dishes, and the famous *kulen* — all best enjoyed with a glass of local wine or craft beer from one of the city's growing number of breweries.

3. REGISTRATION AND ACCREDITATION

The registration process for all athletes will be completed using the Accreditation and Sport Entries delegation registration process in Games Management System (GMS and please refer to the Registration and Accreditation Manual available on Extranet for detailed registration process information). The first step is Final Entries by Number, which NOCs must be submitted by 07. 04. 2025. The next step is submission of the Long List where NOCs should recognize all potential athletes and officials by 20 June 2025. The last step is Short List and specially Sport Entries which is fundamental part of the registration process for athletes and must be done by 7 July 2025.

Lost or Damaged Accreditation Cards – Replacement Procedure

In the event of a lost or damaged card, the following procedure will be applied:

The concerned person must report to the Accreditation Center with a valid ID or a team official present. A short form will be filled out, and the old card will be deactivated. A new card will be printed and issued within the same visit. Each NOC is entitled to one free reprint per person; any further replacements may be subject to administrative approval.

3.1. Sport Entries

Mandatory data for Artistic Gymnastics:

- Name
- Surname
- Date of birth
- FIG License (valid until the end of the artistic gymnastics competition)

Gymnasts who do not have the correct age and a valid FIG license (or the validity of the license has expired) are not allowed to compete. All gymnasts' licenses will be checked by the OC Head of Gymnastics after receipt of the nominative inscriptions.

3.1.1. WAG Floor music

By the deadline of the Short List, 7 July 2025, upload the files of the WAG floor music of your gymnasts to the Extranet, your respective folder. The music



files must be in a .wav or at least high resolution .mp3 (256 kbps) format. The file name must contain:

- CountryCode_Name_Firstname_year_of_birth, (e.g. SLO_Belak_Teja_2009.wav).

At the same time, we are strongly requesting the WAG participants to bring a USB-stick as well with the floor music for training reasons.

By 7 July 2025, it is also mandatory to add description of the music by filling in the form in the excel file „WAG_floor_music_description_Form“ available for download on NOC Extranet, folder SPORT/ARTISTIC GYMNASTICS and uploading to Extranet, your respective folder, with the name and year of birth of the athlete as a description of the file, e.g. „WAG_floor_music_description_Form_SLO_Belak_Teja_2009

By sending the music form you:

- Confirm that the music used does not violate any copyrights and that it can be broadcasted within sports.
- Any claims due to violations of copyrights will have to be borne by the NOC
- Confirm that your music files meet the criteria of the OC.

3.2. Late Athletes Replacement (LAR)

It is possible to make a late athlete from official replacements after the closure of the Short List, right up to the Preliminary inquiry, if necessary, due to injury, urgent medical problems, or other exceptional circumstances. Athletes may be replaced by substitutes only in the same sport, discipline and gender event, except in athletics, judo and swimming, where athletes may be replaced in the same sport and discipline; not specifically in the same gender event. The replacement must be submitted on a form and approved by the EOC, after consultation with the EFs, TDs and the EYOF 2025 OC. All replacements will be resolved on case-by-case basis.

Please note that any substitute athletes or officials will need to have been submitted in the Long List.

Replaced athlete from official must leave the AVL

NOC may also withdraw an athlete or official after the closure from Short List right up to the Preliminary Inquiry. The participation fee will not be reimbursed if a withdrawal occurs.

Replacement during the EYOF Skopje 2025

After the final team registration, there will be no replacements allowed during the competition, not even in case of injuries.



4. ACCOMMODATION

NOC delegations will stay in student dormitories and hotels in Skopje, Kumanovo and Osijek with most NOCs accommodated in Athlete Villages (AVLs) located in central Skopje and Kumanovo. All venues are within a 20 km radius of these AVLs. Other guest groups will stay in hotels near sports venues and AVLs. Family and friends' travel arrangements will be managed by the travel agency, in close coordination with the NOCs and OC. Laundry facilities services for NOC uniforms will be available at each accommodation site, in addition a central laundry service will also be offered to the participants.



The city of Osijek is an ideal host due to its flat terrain, compact layout, and excellent connectivity. All key locations, including accommodation, the training hall, and the main competition venue, are located within a 2.5-kilometer radius, ensuring short and convenient travel times for all participants.

All NOC artistic gymnastics delegations will be accommodated together in the Lavoslav Ružička Student Dormitory (Kralja Petra Svačića 1c, 31000 Osijek), which offers comfortable and functional facilities near the sports venues.

The Lavoslav Ružička Student Dormitory is a modern accommodation facility located in the heart of Osijek's university campus. Designed to provide comfort, functionality, and a supportive academic environment, the dormitory offers housing primarily for students of the University of Osijek. The dormitory is named after Nobel Prize-winning chemist Lavoslav Ružička, reflecting its dedication to academic excellence and student well-being.

5. TRANSPORT

5.1. Arrival & Departure

Airport transfers – The EYOF 2025 Skopje OC will provide free transportation for all accredited people from and to the official airport to the AVLs and hotels, as required.

Transportation from airports to AVLs, and back:

- Free shuttle buses from Skopje International Airport to Skopje and Kumanovo
- Arrivals by own vehicles – Delegations arriving in their own vehicles go directly to their accommodation site.

- ▶ Arrivals by private vehicles – Delegations traveling by their own vehicles will receive detailed instructions in advance to ensure smooth access and arrival at the AVLs in Osijek.

5.2. Transportation


The Organising Committee has established a loop-based EYOF Bus Line transport system in both Skopje and Kumanovo, providing regular access to all key venues and accommodation sites. A dedicated connection is also in place between Skopje and Kumanovo to provide efficient travel between the two cities. EYOF Bus Line is available to all accredited participants.

EYOF Bus Line, referred to as TA Service, represents circular / direct transport from accommodations to training, competition and non-competition venues. EYOF Bus Lines operation dates are from 19 to 27 July.



Transportation between venues in Osijek

During the event, a dedicated transport system will be organized in Osijek for all accredited participants. Shuttle buses will operate continuously in a circular route connecting the Lavoslav Ružička Student Residence, the Sokol Centar training hall, and the Gradski Vrt, main competition venue, ensuring smooth and timely transfers throughout the entire duration of the event.



Accommodation for all participants will be provided at the **Student Dormitory Lavoslav Ružička**,
Address: Julija Knifera 3, 31000 Osijek, Croatia.

The competition and official training sessions will take place at the **Gradski vrt Sports Hall**,
Address: Kneza Trpimira 23, 31000 Osijek, Croatia.

An additional training facility will be available at the **Sokol Sports Center Osijek**,
Address: Kralja Zvonimira 5, 31000 Osijek, Croatia.

Here are the approximate walking distances between the key locations in Osijek:

- **Student Dormitory Lavoslav Ružička to Gradski vrt Sports Hall:** approximately 1.6 km (about 20 minutes on foot).
- **Student Dormitory Lavoslav Ružička to Sokol Sports Center Osijek:** approximately 2.2 km (about 25 minutes on foot).
- **Gradski vrt Sports Hall to Sokol Sports Center Osijek:** approximately 1.2 km (about 15 minutes on foot).

These distances make it convenient for participants to move between accommodation and training or competition venues. Organized shuttle services will further facilitate travel.



6. CATERING

- Breakfast: 06:30–10:00
- Lunch: 12:00–16:00
- Dinner: 18:30–21:00

The menus will be adapted to the competition schedule (match logistics and plain common sense in sports), diet of the athletes, with a lot of pasta, meat, vegetables and fruit. Meal options will include vegetarian food, and choices will be provided for other diets as well as allergies. There will be nutritional and allergy labelling. Access will be once per meal, all participants are entitled to get 3 meals per day: breakfast, lunch and dinner. There will be separate catering in place for the opening and closing ceremony.

Dining in Osijek:

Meals are provided at the **Campus Student Restaurant**, located in the adjacent building at Kralja Petra Svačića 1e. The restaurant has sufficient capacity to accommodate all participants comfortably.

The format will be buffet style, offering sufficient options for different dietary needs and preferences. The quality and variety of the meals will be in line with nutritional standards for high-performance athletes.

Fruit, dairy products, snacks, water, and coffee will be available throughout the day in the competition arena for athletes and coaches. Judges will also have access to a selection of cold cuts and refreshments at the VIP zone café bar.

Exceptions (Late Dinner)

If competitions in any sport are delayed, dinner will be provided for those affected by the delay. However, national teams, athletes and officials participating in the EYOF 2025 are requested to communicate towards the Local Organizers any food intolerances in due time in advance by 7 July.



7. MEDICAL SERVICES CONCEPT

Good medical and rescue services are the key for success and a successful event. The Chief Medical Officer (CMO) of EYOF Osijek 2025 with the medical team, in supervision by the EOC Medical Delegate, will take care of the health of participants at all official venues. Medical services will be of good quality and include the provision of free of charge and in a timely manner healthcare for all accredited persons involved in the EYOF Osijek 2025; that is the Athletes, Team Officials of the NOCs, International and European Sports Federations, the EOC Family and their Guests, as well as the Organisers themselves. Additionally, basic care is extended to spectators at the venues.

Medical services will be provided at the Lavoslav Ružička Student Dormitory (basic level), sport venues (basic and emergency level), and in cooperation with the Host City Hospital (advance level) to the accredited persons from 20 to 26 July 2025.

Medical Meeting for NOC medical representatives will be on 19 July 2025 at 19:00 in Arena Gradski Vrt (Competition venue).

7.1. AVC Medical Care

Medical doctor present at the Student Dormitory Lavoslav Ružička from 20 July to 26 July 2025 daily 08:00–22:00

- Works as a general practitioner
- Able to provide primary care to accredited persons
- Treats some basic conditions (pain, infection, etc.)
- Refers patients to the hospital if needed, organizes transport, communicates with CMO and team doctors, etc.
- Can prescribe drugs if needed by a team doctor (team doctors will have to pay for these at the pharmacy)

8. ANTI-DOPING & TUE



The testing will be performed according to the EOC Anti-Doping Rules and the International Standard for Testing and Investigation. Both urine and blood samples will be collected. All athletes should be familiar with doping control procedures and their rights and responsibilities.

In Osijek, the Sample Collection Authority is Croatian Antidoping Organisation. All samples will be analyzed at the laboratory accredited by the World Anti-Doping Agency in Seibersdorf, Austria.

All athletes should be familiar with doping control procedures and their rights and responsibilities. All athletes have the right to have a doping test representative with them. Athletes who are Minors should be notified in the presence of an Athlete Representative (who is not a Minor) in addition to the Doping Control Officer/Chaperone and may choose to be accompanied by a representative throughout the entire Sample Collection Session.

Bottled water will be available for athletes at the doping control station. Food will not be available for athletes at the doping control station. Athletes or their support staff can bring food for athletes if needed. Upon completion of the doping control procedure, athletes and their representatives can use the EYOF bus lines to return to their accommodation.

We strongly recommend that all athletes before coming to EYOF go through Anti-Doping Education and Learning Platform ([ADEL](#)).

Access to it will be granted to photographers, journalists and videographers with the appropriate accreditation.

This is an interview area near the FOP where media may conduct brief interviews with athletes after their performances.

Athletes must pass through the Mixed Zone when leaving the FOP but are not obligated to stop and speak with the media.



9.4. Photo Zones

Accredited photographers will work from designated photo positions that offer a clear view of the Field of Play (FOP).

To access restricted areas such as the FOP, photographers must wear supplementary identification (e.g., bibs) at all times within the venue. Bibs can be collected from the Media Centre.

9.5. Media Coverage of Training Sessions

Official training sessions are open to media coverage.

The warm-up area is strictly reserved to participants only.

10. SPORT GENERAL INFORMATION

10.1. Official Training Day

19 July 2025 is the first official training date at the EYOF competition and training venues. The Organizing Committee does not provide any training slots not training camps prior to this date.

10.2. Sport information

Mailboxes will be set up at the Sport Information Desk at the competition venue, where the delegation members can find all the necessary information organized from 08:00 to 20:00 at the West Entrance.

No hard copies of any documents (start list, results etc.) will be available for distribution.

All documents will be sent by e-mail to the responsible person from each delegation provided that the correct e-mail address was submitted to the Sport Information Desk.

The relevant documents will also be available on the mobile application. The LOC will distribute log-in details to the Delegation's Responsible Representative to access the application concerned.

All the necessary information will also be communicated via WhatsApp group (mobile phone numbers of the Delegations' Responsible Representatives will be collected for this purpose).

10.3. Information service – start list, results, data and timing system

EYOF Osijek 2025 will implement centralized Results services. Start Lists, Results and all relevant sport data will be available online on the official webpage.

10.4. Bibs and other equipment

OC will be responsible for the Bibs and any other identification of athletes and coaches, for start and finish installations. The competition numbers (bib numbers) will be provided to the NOC at the end of the Team Leader Meeting / Orientation Meeting. The numbers are to be firmly attached to the competition attire throughout the entire competition





10.5. WhatsApp group

For Better flow of all information regarding sport information, there will be Whats'App group created. It is an official communication channel from OC to all participants, works from 19 July 2025.



10.6. Clothes – Advertising

1. One (1) manufacturer's identification AND one (1) NOC sponsor logo of no more than 30 cm² EACH can be displayed on each piece of non-competition clothing.
2. One (1) manufacturer's identification AND one (1) NOC or NF (subject to the approval of the respective NOC) sponsor logo of no more than 30 cm² EACH can be displayed on each piece of competition uniform and equipment in accordance with valid IF/EF rules.
3. No alcohol or tobacco product producers' logos, no betting companies' logos, or the logos of any other sponsors that can damage the image of the EOC and/or Olympic Movement in general will be allowed.
4. Each use of sponsor's logos has to be approved by the EOC in writing.

NOCs are requested to bring a sample of the competition uniform to the first TLM of each sport for the final check in order to avoid any problems on the field of play.

For delegations, staying in Osijek, the EYOF Opening Ceremony will take place in Arena Gradski vrt (Competition venue).

The Closing Ceremony will be for accredited persons only. Following the obligatory protocol elements, a farewell celebration featuring a concert and party will bring the event to a festive conclusion.

Date: 26 July 2025 (20:30)

Place: SC Jane Sandanski (outdoor area)

Duration: No longer than 30 minutes in total

- Ceremony starts at 20:30 and finishes at 21:00
- Farewell party 21:00-23:00
- From 21:30, on pre-agreed schedule, bus transfers to athletes' accommodations until 23:30

For delegations, staying in Osijek, the Closing Ceremony (Banquet) will be for accredited persons only after the obligatory protocol elements in Terra Negra Country club.

10.7.2. Victory Ceremonies

Victory ceremonies take place at each sport venue in accordance with the competition and medal awards schedule for each sport.

Medals shall be awarded to:

- Individual events: the first three athletes
- Group events: first three teams

The goal of the victory ceremony is to honor the athletes who have won a medal, to promote the spirit of Olympism and sportsmanship, and to ensure that the athletes have an unforgettable moment. The ceremonies follow the EOC protocol and shall be conducted at a fast pace without any delays. The ceremonies at different venues will have consistent structure, procedure, and appearance.

Information and guidelines for the medalist:

- The top three athletes/teams in each event must attend the ceremony.
- The ceremony will be postponed if all three medalists cannot be present for objective reasons.
- Athletes shall wait for the award ceremony in the designated protocol area at each venue.
- Before the ceremony begins, athletes shall remove their accreditation, hand it to the person in the protocol room and collect it immediately after the ceremony.



- Athletes may not take any sports equipment or paraphernalia, national flags or other national, cultural, or religious symbols to the podium.
- No demonstrations of any kind or commercial, political, religious, or racial propaganda shall be allowed during the medal ceremony.
- Athletes must attend the ceremony in the official uniform of the national team.
- Athletes are expected to remove their headgear when receiving their medals and to hold it in their hand throughout the ceremony (especially when playing the national anthem and raising the flags).
- Athletes must face the flags during the raising of the flags and the playing of the national anthem.

10.8. Water and ice

OC will provide sufficient quantities of drinking water at all locations, both in bottles and in gallon dispensers with taps. for the athletes and officials at every competition and training venues. Volunteers will also assist the athletes and officials with having access to ice in all competition and training venues.

11. SAFEGUARDING

The OC, in collaboration with the European Olympic Committees (EOC) and the Olympic Committee of North Macedonia, is committed to prioritising the safety, wellbeing, and dignity of all participants. A comprehensive safeguarding system will be implemented to promote a respectful and secure environment throughout the event. The safeguarding program is developed and delivered by IGNITX, the official service provider and event sponsor, based on international safeguarding standards and building on the successful model used at EYOF Bakuriani 2025.

To support effective and impartial handling of concerns, a secure multi-option reporting mechanism will be in place, offering participants three formats to submit a report:

- Through the confidential IGNITX proprietary reporting tool, which allows for anonymous submissions:

All reports will be received by the Safeguarding Unit, which will handle each case with impartiality and full confidentiality. The procedures for managing reports will follow the European Youth Olympic Festival Skopje 2025: Safeguarding Legal Framework for Preparing, Educating, Reporting, Investigating and Managing Alleged Breaches of Safeguarding Policy and remain in line with the policies of the EOC Ethics Commission, which oversees adjudication processes.

As part of the safeguarding structure, CdMs of participating NOCs are requested to appoint the Delegation Safeguarding Point of Contact (DSPC). The appointed DSPC will play a critical role in fostering a safe and respectful environment for all participants. Their primary responsibilities will include raising awareness on safeguarding issues, providing relevant education to the delegation, supervising and preventing transgressive behaviour while maintaining strict confidentiality throughout the process.

Prior to and during the EYOF Skopje 2025, educational materials will be made available to help athletes, team officials, staff and volunteers understand what constitutes transgressive behaviour, learn how to recognise it, and know how to proceed if they witness or experience it.

The safeguarding framework reflects the collective commitment of the Organising Committee, the EOC, participating delegations, and IGNITX to deliver an event environment that is free from transgressive behaviour.

From the official date of arrival until the official day of departure of the event, participants (gymnasts, coaches, judges and any other delegation members) have the opportunity to contact by phone or e-mail the LOC





Safeguarding Officer in case of harassment or abuse of any type or if they are worried or do not feel comfortable.

In addition, posters of the “10 Golden Rules of Gymnastics” – the FIG campaign to raise awareness about youth protection in Gymnastics - will be displayed in several locations, including training and warm-up halls and public zones. The Safeguarding Officer for the gymnastics competitions at EYOF 2025 in Osijek will be Tomislav Marković.

12.1.1. Judges

For WAG and MAG the required number of judges will be assigned.

As a basic principle each NOC with 1 or more gymnasts may propose 1 judge (Cat. 1 – 3) directly to European Gymnastics by 12 May 2025 for approval and nomination. The EG will nominate the judges by 31 May 2025.

The OC is responsible for the arrangement of international travel for all nominated judges (direct contact will be made by the OC with the nominated judges) as well as their registration in GMS, the accommodation & full board and local travel.

The total amount of travel and stay costs of WAG & MAG judges respectively will be divided by the number of NOCs participating and each NOC will pay



their proportionate amount. The OC will invoice each participating NOC in WAG & MAG with the respective “judges fee” which includes the shared contribution for travel costs and a participation fee (€ 880 per person per stay) by 31 August 2025.

Judges’ Instruction and Drawing of Lots

According to the European Gymnastics/TR, the presence of the judges at the judges’ instruction is mandatory. The judges’ instruction will be held in English.

12.1.2. NTOs

Croatia Gymnastics Federation will provide NTOs.

12.2. General Conditions for the organization of the sport

The gymnastics competition will be held in accordance with the European Gymnastics and FIG rules and other rules and regulations, listed below. According to the FIG rules, gymnasts must have a current FIG license, valid until the end of the artistic gymnastics competitions.

Hall “GRADSKI VRT” will become the EYOF 2025 Artistic Gymnastics hall and will host the MAG and WAG competition including the adjacent warm-up hall.

The Sokol Centar, Osijek will be the training venue for EYOF 2025 Artistic Gymnastics.

All venues will be fully equipped with a duly certified SPIETH apparatus.

Additional duly certified landing mats for all apparatus will be provided by the apparatus supplier in the warm-up halls and for podium training. In addition, the Federations can bring small protection mats / pads / coverings only. These mats / pads / coverings (e.g. carpet mats, beam protection pad) must not be thicker than 5cm and not bigger than 1.50m x 1m. These mats / pads / coverings can be used during (podium) training but not for the touch warm up.

12.3.2. Competition format

MAG and WAG Qualification Competition will determine the following:

- Team Final Results
- All-Around Final Results (maximum 2 gymnasts per NOC for the AA ranking)
- Qualification for Mixed Team Final (MTF) and Apparatus Finals (AF)

12.3.2.1. MAG and WAG Mixed Team Final (MTF) - Qualifying Criteria

One (1) Male & One (1) Female Gymnast from each NOC.

The scores of the highest ranked AA Male gymnast on FX, PB & HB PLUS the highest ranked AA Female gymnast on VT, BB & FX from the QC will be added together to determine the Total Mixed Team Result for each NOC.

Qualification is by NAME and not by NOC.

The Best 16 Mixed Teams will qualify from the QC for the Mixed Team Final. 2 reserve teams will be named for the MTF.

12.3.2.2. MAG and WAG Apparatus Finals - Qualifying Criteria

- Day 1 - MAG (FX, PH and SR) and WAG (VT and UB)
- Day 2 - MAG (VT, PB and HB) and WAG (BB and FX)

The 8 highest ranked gymnasts on each apparatus from the Qualification Competition will qualify for the respective Apparatus Final. A maximum number of 2 Gymnasts per NOC are permitted in each Apparatus Final. 3 reserve gymnasts will be named on each Apparatus for each Final.



12.3.2.3. The Qualification Competition (QC)

The starting order for the Qualification Competition is made in accordance with the drawing of lots carried out at the TDs Venue Visit on 13th April 2025 in Osijek.

If NOC reduces the number of participating gymnasts or apparatus after the Long & Short List deadlines, the European Gymnastics TDs have the right to modify the Starting Order so as to ensure the best possible running of the competition. All information about the modification of the Starting Order will be advised during the Team Leader Meeting / Orientation Meeting.

12.3.2.4. Mixed Team Final (MTF)

Round 1

- All 16 Mixed Teams compete in Round 1
- Gymnasts can choose the order on which they compete on the relevant Apparatus, for example, a WAG gymnast may decide to compete on Beam in Round 1 and chose to compete on Vault in Round 2 (Olympic order does not apply)
- An Apparatus cannot be repeated
- If a WAG gymnast chooses to compete on Vault in either Round 1 or Round 2 – _Only 1 Vault is required.

Round 2 – _The Semi Finals

- At the end of Round 1, the 8 Mixed Teams with the **Highest Total Score from Round 1 will qualify for “Round 2 – The Semi Finals.**
- In Round 2, gymnasts must compete on an apparatus they have **not yet** competed on.
- No Scores are carried forward from Round 1 (All Mixed Teams start from 0)
Round 2 will determine what 4 Teams advance to the Bronze Medal (2) & Gold Medal Final (2).

Round 3 – _The Bronze Medal Final

- This round will decide the “Bronze Medal”
- The 3rd placed team from Round 2 will compete against the 4th placed team from Round 2.



- No scores are carried forward from Round 3 (All Mixed Teams start from 0)
- In Round 3, gymnasts must compete on the apparatus they have **not yet** competed on.
- If a WAG gymnast chooses to compete on Vault in Round 3 – _2 Vaults are required with FIG Rules applying.
- The Mixed Team with the **Highest Total Score** at the end of Round 3 will determine the winner of the Bronze Medal.

Round 4 – _The Final

- This Round will decide the Silver & Gold Medal Winners.
- No scores are carried forward from Round 2 (All Mixed Teams start from “0”).
- In Round 4, gymnasts must compete on the apparatus they have **not yet** competed on.
- If a WAG gymnast chose to compete on Vault in Round 4 – _2 Vaults are required with FIG Rules applying.
- The Mixed Team with the **Highest Total Score** at the end of Round 4 will determine the ranking for Silver & Gold Medals.

MTF Tie Break Rules



- In accordance with the FIG TRs, ties may not be broken.
- If for medical reasons, the best ranked AA Female (on 3 apparatus) / AA Male Gymnast (on 3 apparatus) from the QC withdraws, the second ranked gymnast from the NOC can only replace her / him, if the new Total Score is higher than that of the NOC in 1st Reserve.

If more than 8 gymnasts qualify for the Apparatus Final, another drawing of lots will take place, to reflect the number of qualified gymnasts.

12.3.2.6. Changes to the Starting Order – Apparatus Finals

If a qualified gymnast is unable to take part in the AF Competition, then they can be replaced by the next gymnast from their NOC, on the condition that their result is better than that of the first reserve. This new gymnast will take the starting position of the gymnast they replace.

Withdrawals / replacements of gymnasts for medical reasons will be accepted provided that the above-mentioned conditions are met. They are to be submitted using Appendix 7, via the Sport Information Desk for the attention of:

- For the MAG competition to Mr. James MAY, the MAG Technical Delegate
- For the WAG competition to Mrs. Christine FRAUENKNECHT, the WAG Technical Delegate

If a gymnast competes in two (or more) successive Apparatus Finals and medals in the preceding Final (thus reducing the gymnasts' opportunity to return to the warm-up hall prior to the next Final), the TD will adjust the start order, if necessary.

12.3.2.7. Tie Breaking Rules

In accordance with the FIG TRs, ties may not be broken.



12.3.2.8. Touch Warm-up during the Competition

Warm-up times according to the FIG rules:

- The general warm-up will take place in the warm-up hall.
- A touch warm-up will be permitted in the QC, MTF & AF on the Podium
- For Apparatus Finals, the gymnasts will be permitted to train on the Podium in the Competition Hall prior to the commencement of the Apparatus Finals Competition, on Friday and on Saturday. This warm-up will end 30 minutes before the start of the competition.
- In Apparatus Finals, the first 4 gymnasts will warm-up and compete followed by the remaining 4 gymnasts' warming-up and competing.

12.3.2.9. Access to the Competition Area

The competition area is accessible to members of the various juries, competing gymnasts and their accredited coaches, to local group leaders, to the auxiliary personnel of the Jury, to the official doctor, to the team doctors, medical staff and to persons concerned with the apparatus as well as the LOC personnel.

Interpreters may not enter the competition area without the permission of the Technical Delegate.

The competition area is strictly forbidden to all other persons.

Gymnasts are permitted to return to the warm-up hall during Podium Training & / Competitions, without any special approval, in order to share the designated stretching area and the apparatus. Priority will nevertheless always be given to any gymnast's warming-up for the following subdivision. Therefore, permission will be required from any NOC(s) warming-up on the Apparatus before the gymnasts coming from the Competition Hall may use a specific apparatus. Gymnasts will be fully responsible to return to the competition hall when required in order to perform their routine on time.

Concerning the presence of the coaches and medical team on the podium, the following provisions will apply:

- For full Teams in the QC (2-3 gymnasts), 2 coaches are allowed (WAG – 1 must be female).
- For NOC's with Individual Gymnasts in the QC, ONLY 1 coach is allowed (WAG – Male / Female).
- For NOC's with gymnasts in the MTF, 1 coach per gymnast is allowed (WAG – Male / Female).
- For NOC's with Individual Gymnasts in the AF, 1 coach per gymnast is allowed (WAG - Male / Female).
- For all competitions, 1 team medical person per discipline and per National Federation is allowed.

12.3.2.10. Use of Electronic Communication Devices

During the duration of official European Gymnastics competitions (which is defined as starting the moment the first gymnast enters the field of play and ending the moment the last score is publicly displayed):

- Judges on the field of play are absolutely prohibited from using mobile phones and any other kind of electronic communication devices.
- Other delegation members (gymnasts, coaches, medical staff) are prohibited from using cellular phones and any other kind of electronic communication devices, except for when listening to music (with earphones and at a sound level which is not observable for surrounding persons). Other delegation members are also allowed to take photos (but no videos), without flash and must not interrupt the running of the competition.
- If these rules are violated, the persons concerned will receive a verbal warning followed by a written warning if repeated.
- If this behaviour is repeated after the written warning is issued, those persons concerned will be excluded for the rest of the competition.
- The Superior Jury is responsible to decide these disciplinary measures.
- Appeals against these decisions have to be submitted to the Jury of Appeal whose decision is final.

12.3.2.12. Scoring and distribution of Results

After each competition, the results will be provided on the official websites of the EYOF.

All lists and results will be available on the Mobile Application and will also be sent via E-mail and WhatsApp Group to the Delegation Representatives (contact info of the Delegations' Representatives will be collected at the Sport Information Desk).

Scoring will be carried out by GymScoring. A Video Control system will be provided.

At the end of the EYOF, the results book including the Judges' individual scores for all competitions will be sent by e-mail to the Delegation Representatives.



12.3.2.13. New Elements

New elements should be submitted as soon as possible by email to the President of the Superior Jury, but no later than 24 hours before the commencement of Podium Training. A technical drawing and a video must be attached to the e-mail.

Any close family relative to a competitive gymnast may not judge that gymnast or his/her unit (pair, group, etc.) at any FIG sanctioned event.

12.3.4.3. The D-Jury

The D1 & D2 judges were nominated by the Technical Delegates according to the category of the judges in the current FIG cycle.

D Judges are permitted to attend all Training sessions.

12.3.4.4. The E-Jury

The E judges will be decided by the drawing of lots on site.

The E-jury for the QC consists of four (4) E-Judges. The final E-score will be determined from the average of the two middle scores.

The E-jury for MTF & AF will consist of five (5) E-Judges. The Final E-score will be determined from the average of the three middle scores.

All entered judges must be available until the drawing of lots for the last competition of the respective discipline.

For AF, a NOC whose gymnast has qualified for an Apparatus Final (including 1st Reserve) will as a result, not have their judge included in the Judges Draw for the concerned Apparatus.

Cat 4 judges, if present, are only allowed to judge line and time.

As a reminder and according to the European Gymnastics / TR, the function of a Judge cannot be combined with any other function.

E-judges are only permitted to attend the Training sessions of their NOC's.

12.3.4.6. Inquiries to the score

European Gymnastics applies the [FIG/TR](#). The detailed procedure is laid down in the Technical Regulations of the FIG.



If the inquiry is refused, or if the final score remains unchanged or is lowered, the amount will be invoiced by European Gymnastics (in Euro, not in USD), at a later date and must be paid within one month.

12.3.5. Clothing and sport equipment

The official uniforms of the NOCs may also include:

- Symbols of the country (name of the country, national flag, emblem, etc.), consistent with the FIG Advertising and Publicity Rules
- Emblem of the NOC Logo of the EYOF 2025
- Emblem of the respective National Sport Federation

Please note that the NOC is responsible for the appearance of the official uniforms.

12.3.6. Victory Ceremonies

The ceremonies take place immediately after the competition at the competition venue. **In accordance with the [FIG TR](#)**, gymnasts must wear NOC track suit during the Victory ceremony.




