<p><b>COMPETITION  FORMAT  SEE ALSO WORLD  CUP RULES</b></p>	<p>Competitions consist of Qualifications, Semi-Finals (Speed only) and Finals. The score from Qualification will not be carried forward. All runs, also the Finals, start from 0 points.</p> <p><b>Speed</b></p> <p>Speed competitions will be organized on two parallel lanes. At each event, the FIG Technical Delegate (in consultation with the CJP) will designate lane numbers.</p> <p><b>Speed Qualifications</b></p> <p>The starting order for the first run of Qualification will be determined by a draw. An intermediate ranking list is established at the end of the first run. The final ranking list of the Qualification will be established at the end of the second run. In case of a tie at any place, the tie-breaking rules set out in art. 4.1 apply.</p> <p><b>Speed Semi-Finals (max 3 per NF)  Knock-out competition format</b></p> <p>The top athletes from the final ranking list of the Qualification participate in the Semi-Finals. No second run is possible. In case of a tie at any place, the tie-breaking rules set out in art. 4.1 applies</p>

The highest ranked athlete faces the lowest ranked athlete, and the loser of that race is excluded from advancing to the final. Another example, the athlete ranked 2<sup>nd</sup> faces the 2<sup>nd</sup> to last athlete from the Qualification and so on for each athlete to be matched against the appropriate competitor. The loser of each race is excluded from advancing to the final.

In case of a tie at the 6<sup>th</sup> rank for the Final, the tie-breaking rules set out in art. 4.1 apply. Three reserve athletes will be able to warm-up for the Semi-Final and Final rounds. If a reserve athlete replace a participant he will take the last qualified place.

If 3 athletes from the same NF finish in the top places for finals, the one with the slowest time is eliminated from qualifying for the final. The best 2 athletes from the same NF qualify, and all others advance one place in the new start list for the Final.

**Speed Finals (max 2 per NF)**

The top six or ten athletes (depending on competition size) from the final ranking list of the Qualification or the semi-finals participate in the Final.

In the final round, the athletes run by pairs (see table above). The final ranking is based on the time (no knock out).

	<p>In case of a tie at any place, the tie-breaking rules set out in art. 4.1 apply.</p> <p><b>Freestyle Qualifications</b></p> <p>The starting order for the first run of Qualification will be determined by a draw. The runs of 20 to 45 seconds, are judged based on the criteria defined in the Code of Points. In case of a tie at any place, the tie-breaking rules set out in art. 4.2 apply.</p> <p><b>Freestyle Finals (max 2 per NF)</b></p> <p>The top eight athletes from the final ranking list of the Qualification participate in the Final. In case of a tie at any place, the tie-breaking rules set out in art. 4.2 apply. The starting order is established based on the ranking after Qualification with the best athlete starting last. Should the host country not qualify, they will receive a wildcard for the Final. Therefore, one additional athlete would be added to the final. The wildcard athlete must be the highest ranked athlete for that country from the Qualification.</p>
<p><b>TIE BREAKING RULES</b></p>	<p><b>Tie-breaking rules for the speed ranking</b></p> <p>Time is measured in 1/1000<sup>th</sup> of a second and shown in 1/100<sup>th</sup> of a second. If there is a tie, the tie will be broken by using the next digit (1/1000<sup>th</sup> of a second). If there is still a tie, the tie will not be broken. <i>Exception:</i> To determine the starting order and the pairs in the Final, the ties must be broken by a draw.</p> <p><b>Tie-breaking rules for the freestyle ranking</b></p> <p>In case of a tie in points at any place in Qualification and Finals, the ranking will be determined by the following criteria: The higher score for E (Execution) The average of all judges' scores given for E (Execution), without eliminating the highest and the lowest score The average of all judges' scores given for D (Difficulty), without eliminating the highest and the lowest score If there is still a</p>

<b>FEDERATIONS INVITED PARTICIPATION</b>	<p>The Organizing Member Federation must invite all World Gymnastics Member Federations who have paid their annual membership fee for Parkour.</p> <p>During the 2026 World Cup Series, World Gymnastics is entitled to invite the five best ranked athletes in each event from the valid World Cup Ranking List, as well as the reigning World Champion.</p>
<b>SIZE OF DELEGATION AND FIG LICENCE</b>	<p>Only senior athletes in good standing with the correct age and holding a valid FIG Licence at the time of the nominative registration until the end of the competitions may participate.</p> <p>The maximum size of the invited delegation is as follows:</p>
<b>COACHES</b>	<p>No coaches will be accepted in this World Cup without a valid coach-sport profile at the deadline of the Nominative Registration. In order to be considered, the coach-sport profile (including all relevant documents) must be submitted in FIG Database on April, 1<sup>st</sup> 2026 at the very latest (two weeks prior to the deadline for Nominative Registration).</p>
<b>AGE LIMITS</b>	<p>17 years in the year of the competition (born in 2009 or before)</p>
<b>JUDGES AND JUDGES' PANELS</b>	<p>Each Judges' Panel consists of:</p> <p><b>Speed:</b> minimum seven (7) judges (including one of them who acts also as CJP): one (1) ST judge, two (2) T judges and four (4) L judges.</p> <p><b>Freestyle:</b> minimum eight (8) judges including one of them who acts also as CJP (depending on the level of the competition): three (3) E judges, three (3) D judges and two (2) L judges.</p> <p>Difficulty judges are nominated and invited by World</p>

	Gymnastics. Execution judges are drawn from the participating federations on-site and attend at the expense of their NF.						
<b>FIG TECHNICAL DELEGATE</b>	The World Gymnastics Technical Delegate will be designated by the FIG.

<b>DRAWING OF LOTS</b>	<p>The Athletes drawing of lots will take place during the orientation meeting. Registrations made after the athletes' drawing of lots will not be accepted.</p>						
<b>ENTRY FEES</b>	<p>The non-reimbursable cost for the Entry Fee is of 50 EUR per athlete.</p> <p>The invited participating federations must pay for all entry fees. At the time of the Nominative registration (1 month prior to the event) 100% of the entry fee must be paid to the LOC.
