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JUDGES AND JURIES	Each federation may bring up to 2 judges. All judges must have a current valid FIG brevet at the time of the event for the respective discipline RG. All judges must be minimum Cat III. These Continental championships are considered as group 2 competitions.																
ENTRY FEES	The Entry fees for event are as follows: - Participation with only one (1) gymnast: USD 50 - Participation with more than one (1) gymnast: USD 150 for the team - The entry fee is non-refundable and payable to the UAG. 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ACCREDITATION	Each federation will be taken to the accreditation desk upon arrival. In order to accelerate the accreditation procedure, please send to the Local organizing committee by email: region5@sagf.co.za a photo of each delegation member together with the Nominative registration deadline. The specification of the photo should be as follows: Files format: JPG, JPEG File name: NF_Surname_Firstname Note: the LOC will be checking the validity of the gymnast's licenses. During the accreditation the Head of Delegation must present the following: - All passports /Medical insurance of the registered gymnasts. - Competitor's Music must be preloaded onto a google drive – details will be provided. - National Anthem.																

EVENT FORMAT	• Proof of full payment of the costs due to the LOC. • Transport – Departure. • License of the gymnast. • Accreditation must be worn by all gymnasts, coaches and officials at all times, as it identifies where access is permitted at the venue. In addition, the LOC will distribute information regarding the gymnasts' safeguarding plan.	
	The Oceanian Championships will consist of an All-Around Qualification, an All - Around Ranking and a Team Ranking. A ranking of in total 8 RGI routines from 2 – 3 individual gymnasts per federation from the Qualification to decide the continental quota places for 2 – 3 individual gymnasts to the 2026 WCH. All other federations not qualified among the quota places for 2-3 gymnasts will have the right to participate in the 2026 WCH with 1 Individual gymnast.	
OCEANIA CHAMPIONSHIPS	Oceania Federations will compete at the Oceanian Rhythmic Championships for 2026. This event will serve as the Oceania Continental Championships. Delegation Size The maximum delegation size of individual gymnasts is three (+1 reserve). The maximum delegation size for RGG is ten (+2 reserves) or two groups (plus reserves). Competition Format For the RGI Team Competition, Federations can enter up to 3 Senior International Individual athletes. Up to 3 athletes can compete on any apparatus, with the top 2 scores per apparatus (8 scores total) to contribute to the RGI Team score. Federations entering only one athlete will remain eligible for World Championships qualification and All-Around ranking (if eligible) but will not be considered for the team ranking. The RGI All-Around ranking will be based on the scores from the RGI Team competition. Only athletes that compete all 4 apparatus are eligible for an All-Around ranking. For the RGG competition, Federations can enter 1-2 Senior Groups. Groups will compete 2 routines – same & mixed apparatus. Groups must compete both routines (same & mixed) for an All-Around ranking. Awards OGU medals will be awarded to the Top 3 Federations in the RGI Team competition, the RGI All-Around ranking & RGG Competition. Medals will be awarded to the athletes (not including the reserve athlete) & the Federation's Team Coach (maximum 1). World Championships Quota Places for Individuals The RGI Team results will be based on the Qualification Round (30th April & 1st May) of the competition. The ranking and results will be separate from African Rhythmic Championships. The Oceania Continental Individual Quota place (2-3 gymnasts) will be allocated to the Federation with the highest RGI Team All-Around score. The Oceania Continental Individual Quota places (1 individual) will be allocated to the highest-scoring Federations from the All-Around ranking who did not qualify the Quota place for 2-3 Individual gymnasts.	
PRIZE MONEY	OGU will award the athletes in the winning teams of the Team competition a total of A\$600. This prize money is free of any taxes or duties payable.

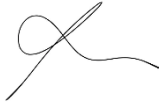

ANTI-DOPING	<u>Doping controls</u> Doping controls will be organized by the International Testing Agency (ITA) on behalf of the FIG and according to the World Anti-Doping Code (WADC), the international standards enacted by the World Anti-doping Agency (WADA) and FIG Anti-Doping Rules.	
VISA	Please verify immediately with your travel agent or the South African Embassy or Consulate in your country if a visa is required for your travel to South Africa. The LOC will be happy to assist each Delegation member with an official invitation letter, provided that the request is made before 31 March 2026 to the LOC. The request must include the function, full name, gender, date of birth, citizenship and passport number, passport expiry date, the arrival and departure dates of the Delegation Member as well as the city the visa application support letter must be sent to. Please ensure that all information is complete and accurate to avoid delays in visa processing.	
INSURANCE	The Host Federation, the LOC and World Gymnastics will not be held responsible for any liabilities in case of accidents, illness (including COVID-19), repatriation and the like. In accordance with the FIG Technical Regulations, all participating Federations are responsible for ensuring that all Delegation Members have valid insurance coverage for illness, accidents, and repatriation during the entire duration of their stay. It is mandatory that Delegation Members are covered by basic insurance (covering sickness, accident, and repatriation) in their country of residence, in order to benefit from coverage by the FIG IMSSA subsidiary insurance. SAFEGUARDING	From the official day of arrival until the official day of departure, all participants — including gymnasts, coaches, judges, and other Delegation Members — will have the possibility to contact the LOC Safeguarding Officer by phone or email in case of: • Harassment • Abuse of any kind • Any situation where they feel uncomfortable or unsafe The contact information for the LOC Safeguarding Officer will be provided to all Delegations upon arrival on site. As part of the FIG's commitment to athlete welfare and youth protection, posters

INTERNATIONAL TRANSPORTATION	The invited participating federations must pay for the travel costs of their delegation members The Travel Schedule Form must be returned to the LOC by 31 March 2026.		
LOCAL TRANSPORTATION	The Organising committee will provide transportation from OR Tambo International Airport to the Hotel for the delegations who have booked their accommodation through the LOC. Transportation between the official hotel and competition venue (which includes the training venue) will be provided by LOC.
