COMPETITION FORMAT SEE ALSO WORLD CUP RULES	Competitions consist of Qualifications, Semi-Finals (Speed only) and Finals. The score from Qualification will not be carried forward. All runs, also the Finals, start from 0 points. Speed Speed competitions will be organized on two parallel lanes. At each event, the FIG Technical Delegate (in consultation with the CJP) will designate lane numbers. Speed Qualifications The starting order for the first run of Qualification will be determined by a draw. An intermediate ranking list is established at the end of the first run. The final ranking list of the Qualification will be established at the end of the second run. In case of a tie at any place, the tie-breaking rules set out in art. 4.1 apply. Speed Semi-Finals (max 3 per NF) Knock-out competition format The top athletes from the final ranking list of the Qualification participate in the Semi-Finals. No second run is possible. In case of a tie at any place, the tie-breaking rules set out in art. 4.1 applies The highest ranked athlete faces the lowest ranked athlete, and the loser of that race is excluded from advancing to the final. Another example, the athlete ranked 2nd faces the 2nd to last athlete from the Qualification and so on for each athlete to be matched against the appropriate competitor. In case of a tie at the 6th rank for the Final, the tie-breaking rules set out in art. 4.1 apply. Three reserve athletes will be able to warm-up for the Semi-Final and Final rounds. If a reserve athlete replace a participant he will take the last qualified place. If 3 athletes from the same NF finish in the top places for finals, the one with the slowest time is eliminated from qualifying for the final. The best 2 athletes from the same NF qualify, and all others advance one place in the new start list for the Final. Speed Finals (max 2 per NF) The top six or ten athletes (depending on competition size) from the final ranking list of the Qualification or the semi-finals participate in the Final. In the final round, the athletes run by pairs (see table above). The final ranking is based on the time (no knock out). In case of a tie at any place, the tie-breaking rules set out in art. 4.1 apply. Freestyle Qualifications The starting order for the first run of Qualification will be determined by a draw. The runs of 20 to 45 seconds, are judged based on the criteria defined in the Code of Points. In case of a tie at any place, the tie-breaking rules set out in art. 4.2 apply. Freestyle Finals (max 2 per NF) The top eight athletes from the final ranking list of the Qualification participate in the Final. In case of a tie at any place, the tie-breaking rules set out in art. 4.2 apply.				

	The starting order is established based on the ranking after Qualification with the best athlete starting last. Should the host country not qualify, they will receive a wildcard for the Final. Therefore, one additional athlete would be added to the final. The wildcard athlete must be the highest ranked athlete for that country from the Qualification.
TIE BREAKING RULES	Tie-breaking rules for the speed ranking Time is measured in 1/1000th of a second and shown in 1/100th of a second. If there is a tie, the tie will be broken by using the next digit (1/1000th of a second). If there is still a tie, the tie will not be broken. Exception: To determine the starting order and the pairs in the Final, the ties must be broken by a draw. Tie-breaking rules for the freestyle ranking In case of a tie in points at any place in Qualification and Finals, the ranking will be determined by the following criteria: The higher score for E (Execution) The average of all judges' scores given for E (Execution), without eliminating the highest and the lowest score The average of all judges' scores given for D (Difficulty), without eliminating the highest and the lowest score If there is still a tie, the tie will not be broken. Exception: To determine the starting order and the pairs in the Speed Final, the ties must be broken by a draw For Prize money: The prize money of the tied ranks will be added and divided by the number of ties. For World Cup Points: The World Cup points of the tied ranks will be added and divided by the number of ties.
FEDERATIONS INVITED PARTICIPATION	The Organizing Member Federation must invite all World Gymnastics Member Federations who have paid their annual membership fee for Parkour. During the 2026 World Cup Series, World Gymnastics is entitled to invite the five best ranked athletes in each event from the valid World Cup Ranking List, as well as the reigning World Champion.

FIG LICENCE	Only senior athletes in good standing with the correct age and holding a valid FIG Licence at the time of the nominative registration until the end of the competitions may participate.						
COACHES	No coaches will be accepted in this World Cup without a valid coach-sport profile at the deadline of the Nominative Registration. In order to be considered, the coach-sport profile (including all relevant documents) must be submitted in FIG Database on September 16, 2026 at the very latest (two weeks prior to the deadline for Nominative Registration).						
AGE LIMITS	17 years in the year of the competition (born in 2009 or before)						
JUDGES AND JUDGES' PANELS	Each Judges' Panel consists of: Speed: minimum seven (7) judges (including one of them who acts also as CJP): one (1) ST judge, two (2) T judges and four (4) L judges. Freestyle: minimum eight (8) judges including one of them who acts also as CJP (depending on the level of the competition): three (3) E judges, three (3) D judges and two (2) L judges. Difficulty judges are nominated and invited by World Gymnastics. Execution judges are drawn from the participating federations on-site and attend at the expense of their NF.						
FIG TECHNICAL DELEGATE	The World Gymnastics Technical Delegate will be designated by the FIG.						
REGISTRATION DEADLINES	Definitive and Nominative Registrations must be made exclusively on-line via the FIG database. DRAWING OF LOTS	The Athletes drawing of lots will take place during the orientation meeting. Registrations made after the athletes' drawing of lots will not be accepted.						

ENTRY FEES	The non-reimbursable cost for the Entry Fee is of CNY390 per athlete. The invited participating federations must pay for all entry fees. At the time of the Nominative registration (1 months prior to the event) 100% of the entry fee must be paid to the LOC. Entries without payment of the entry fees will be considered as invalid and will be refused.

MEALS	All invited Member Federations shall cover the meals at their

	own cost. World Gymnastics will cover the meals for the invited athletes. There is a possibility to order lunch and dinner only for those accommodated via the LOC. The price is CNY 180 per meal. All meals are served at Holiday Inn Express Beijing Shougang Xiu Lake (Official Tournament Hotel). While the Meals Form must be returned to the LOC by 30 August 2026 at the very latest, the costs for the meals must be paid to the LOC by 30 August 2026 as follows: Cancellations or modifications of the meals/ number of people are accepted by 30 September 2026. The LOC will reimburse 100% of the amount for the canceled meals/persons based on the payment. After 30 September 2026 no money for any cancellations can be reimbursed. Considering the doping tests during the event, the organizing committee provides specialized and reliable catering services for athletes. Participants are advised to dine at the designated dining halls arranged by the committee whenever possible.
INTERNATIONAL TRANSPORTATION	All invited Member Federations shall bear the transportation costs of their delegation members to Beijing Capital Airport or Beijing Daxing Airport. Travel itineraries must be submitted to the LOC no later than 30 August 2026.
LOCAL TRANSPORTATION	Free shuttle bus service from the airport to official hotels will be provided for all delegation members on official arrival and departure days, provided the Travel Schedule Form is returned to the LOC by 30 August 2026. E-mail: info@gymnastics.org.cn The official Hotels will be located in a walking distance to the competition site. No transportation is needed or provided.
VISA	Please consult your local travel agency or Chinese Embassy/Consulate in your country immediately to verify whether a visa is required for travel to China. The LOC can issue official invitation letters for each delegation member, provided that applications are submitted to the LOC no later than 11 August. E-mail: info@gymnastics.org.cn Application documents shall clearly state each person's position, full name, gender, date of birth, nationality, passport number, passport expiry date, arrival and departure dates, as well as the city where the visa application support letter must be sent to.
INSURANCE	The Host Federation, the LOC and the FIG will not be held responsible for any liabilities in case of accidents, illness (including COVID-19), repatriation and the like. The FIG Technical Regulations foresee that all participating

	Federations are responsible for making their own arrangements to have the necessary valid insurance coverage against illness, accidents and repatriation for all the members of their Delegation. Please also refer to https://www.gymnastics.sport/site/pages/medical-insurance.php for additional information regarding the FIG IMSSA insurance for Athletes and Judges. The LOC will verify the insurance coverage upon arrival of the delegation members (e.g., a cover note or a photocopy of the valid policy). The insurance must be valid at least starting from the arrival day of the delegation and must last for the delegations' entire stay. Delegation members with insufficient insurance coverage must inform the LOC in advance. The LOC will subsequently offer insurance coverage at the Federations own charge as follows: CNY485 per person/week.																
ACCREDITATION	Accreditation procedure will be confirmed in due time. Access to the area Field of Play dedicated to Parkour will be given only to authorised persons (accreditation). In addition, the LOC will distribute information regarding the Athletes' safeguarding plan.																
FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS	Federations which have not fulfilled their financial obligations towards the FIG or the LOC may not be allowed to participate in this FIG World Cup. Federations which have not fulfilled their financial obligations towards the Organizing Member federations upon arrival will not be accredited.

Separate World Cup Ranking Lists for: • Speed men • Speed women • Freestyle men • Freestyle women are established for the World Cup Series, beginning with the first World Cup competition of the series and ending with the last World Cup event of the series. 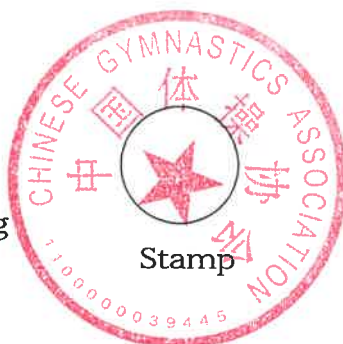

ANTI-DOPING	<u>Doping controls</u> Doping controls will be organised by the International Testing Agency (ITA) on behalf of World Gymnastics and according to the World Anti-Doping Code (WADC), the international standards enacted by the World Anti-doping Agency (WADA) and FIG Anti-Doping Rules.
	<u>Host federation WADC compliance</u> The exploitation of any rights related to the hosting of an event is subject, at all times, to the compliance with the WADC and the international standards enacted by WADA. Regardless of whether the event has already been allocated or not, World Gymnastics may terminate any collaboration with the host federation or the LOC, immediately and without paying any penalty and/or compensation or incurring liability of any kind, under the following circumstances: • if the National Anti-Doping Organisation (NADO) in charge in the concerned country is declared non-compliant by WADA • if the relevant country has been ruled ineligible to host the event. In such cases, World Gymnastics is entitled to reassign the event to any other host federation in another country where

	the WADC and the WADA international standards are fully respected.
SAFEGUARDING	From the official event day of arrival until the official day of departure, participants (athletes, coaches, judges and any other delegation members) have the possibility to contact by phone or e-mail the LOC Safeguarding Officer in case of harassment and abuse of any type or if they are worried and do not feel comfortable. The information regarding the LOC Safeguarding Officer will be communicated upon arrival of the delegations on site. In addition, posters of the “10 Golden Rules of Gymnastics”, the World Gymnastics campaign to raise awareness about youth protection in Gymnastics, will have to be displayed in several locations, including training and warm-up halls and public zones. The information regarding the LOC Safeguarding Officer will be communicated upon arrival of the delegations and at the Orientation meeting.
