SPECIFIC RULES FOR TRAMPOLINE GYMNASTICS

March 2024

The FIG has approved the 2025-2028 FIG General Judges' Rules which are applicable to all competitive disciplines. The specific rules and clarifications listed below apply only to this discipline and are in compliance with the General Judges' Rules.

ARTICLE 1 JUDGES' COURSES

The Intercontinental and the International Judges Course in TRA, TUM and DMT will last 4 days, including the examination days.

The Course will include a practical execution, difficulty and [CJP examination on video](#).

1.1 Intercontinental Judges Course

Each NF is entitled to register a maximum of five (5) judges plus their current Cat. 1 judges.

Current and new FIG TRA-TC members, along with Continental Union TC Presidents, are in addition to these quotas.

Judges participating must be Category 1, 2, or 3, at least, in one of the three disciplines (TRA or TUM or DMT).

All participating judges must attend all theoretical lectures and practical judging sessions in all 3 disciplines (TRA, TUM and DMT) during the course.

All judges who wish to raise or maintain their category must take the examination.

All participating judges can take examination in all 3 disciplines (TRA, TUM and DMT) if they already hold a valid brevet in those disciplines (Cat.4 included).

Judges not holding a valid brevet in one discipline can follow the course and take the online exam to achieve a Cat.4 brevet.

1.2 International Judges Course

FIG Judges with Category 1, 2, 3 or 4 and judges with the highest national brevet may participate.

Each NF is entitled to register a maximum of ten (10 judges) per course. Should places be available after the registration deadline, additional judges may be accepted among the judges registered by their federation as "reserves".

All participating judges must attend all theoretical lectures and practical judging sessions in all 3 disciplines (TRA, TUM and DMT) during the course.

All judges willing to raise or maintain their category must take the examination.

All participating judges can take examination in all 3 disciplines (TRA, TUM and DMT).

Participants are able to qualify up to Category 2.

If the minimum passing grade is not achieved by a judge at the Intercontinental Course, that judge may retest at an International Course or at the retest exam. Judges who fail or wish to achieve higher score may retest at other International Judges' Course.

1.3 Online Examination

These exams are conducted for participants who want to get a FIG category 4 brevet. They are open to judges holding a valid FIG brevet or with, at least, the highest national federation level.

There is no limit of participants per NF.

Participants can achieve only Category 4.

1.4 Examination Retest

The retest course hosted by FIG will have a maximum of 35 participants. The course will be filled on a first come, first serve basis.

All NFs may register a maximum of 2 eligible judges, along with reserves. After the deadline, in case of remaining places, the course will be filled one by one by reserves from each NF based on a first come, first serve basis.

A judge who wishes to achieve a higher score may retest at another International Judges' Course.

A judge who failed and wish to obtain a brevet has to attend the entire course and take the examination.

Judges who wish to retest must submit the retesting application form to the FIG Office and to the TRA-TC President prior to the International Course (retest). It is possible to retest in either one, two or three disciplines.

15th cycle Cat. 1 judges with repetition of both Theory and Practical exams, Category 2 is the maximum that can be obtained, provided the judge has fulfilled the necessary experience criteria for Category 2.

With successful repetition of the Theory and Practical, all judges will be awarded the category, as was indicated by all standards achieved on the second examination.

ARTICLE 2 EXAMINATION

Contents and evaluation of the examination.

2.1 Trampoline

2.1.1 Execution

There will be twenty (20) exercises in the examination, each exercise is worth **11 points**.

For each 1/10th difference from the TRA TC evaluation for a single element, 1.0 pt. deduction will be made.

Maximum score: **220** points

Minimum (pass) score: **120** points

2.1.2 Difficulty

There will be ten (10) exercises in the examination, each exercise is worth **21 points**.

The difficulty of the exercises will be adequate to International and World Class level.

The exercise must be documented with the FIG Numeric System and Difficulty

For each error, deduct 1.0 point.

Maximum score: **210** points

Minimum (pass) score: **160** points

2.1.3 CJP

This exam will be composed of ten (10) videos presenting different situations occurring at live competitions. Candidates will see the video and take the right decision.

10 questions, based on the Code of Points and Technical Regulations

Maximum score: **10** points

Minimum (pass) score: **6** points

2.1.4 Total

Maximum score: **440 points**

2.2 Tumbling

2.2.1 Execution

There will be twenty (20) exercises in the examination, each exercise is worth **9 points**.

For each 1/10th difference from the TRA TC evaluation for a single element, 1.0 pt. deduction.

Maximum score: **180 points**

Minimum (pass) score: **96 points**

2.2.2 Difficulty

There will be ten (10) exercises in the examination, each pass is worth **9-17 points**.

The exercises have to be documented with the FIG Tumbling Symbols and difficulty.

For each error, 1.0 pt. deduction will be made.

Maximum score: **170 points**

Minimum (pass) score: **120 points**

2.2.3 CJP

Ten (10) questions, based on the Code of Points and Technical Regulations

Maximum score: **10 points**

Minimum (pass) score: **6 points**

2.2.4 Total

Maximum score: **360 points**

2.3 Double Mini-trampoline

2.3.1 Execution

There will be twenty (20) exercises in the examination, each exercise is worth **3 points**.

For each 1/10th difference from the TRA TC evaluation for a single element, 1.0 pt. deduction.

Maximum score: **60 points**

Minimum (pass) score: **36 points**

2.3.2 Difficulty

There will be ten (10) exercises in the examination, each exercise is worth **4 points**.

The exercises have to be documented with the FIG numeric system and difficulty.

For each error, 1.0 pt. deduction will be made.

Maximum score: **40 points**

Minimum (pass) score: **32 points**

2.3.3 CJP

Ten (10) questions, based on the Code of Points and Technical Regulations

Maximum score: **10 points**

Minimum (pass) score: **6 points**

2.3.4 Total

Maximum score: **110 points**

These rules will enter into effect on 1st January 2025 and are also available for the Judges' courses to be held in 2024.
