World Cup qualifying events process and ranking

OG 2024 Trampoline

ART. 1 GENERAL PRINCIPLES

The 2023 and 2024 Trampoline Individual World Cup Series will be qualifying for the 2024 Olympic Games only for Individual Trampoline competitors. This document should be read in conjunction with FIG Technical Regulations, [Olympic Qualification System Paris 2024 TRA](#), and FIG TRA World Cup Rules.

Five (5) World Cup competitions will be held through this period, according to the following distribution:

Three (3) World Cup qualifying events competition in 2023 (June – October)

Two (2) World Cup qualifying events competition in 2024 (March – April)

If there are only two applications for 2023, one additional World Cup qualifying event could be held in 2024. Should one of the World Cup in 2023 could not be held for any reason, it could be replaced by a World Cup in early 2024 (February), provided directives can be sent to NF before December 31st, 2023.

The two (2) best results out of the five (5) events will be taken into consideration, regardless the number of competitions the athletes participated in.

Should there be only four (4) World Cup qualifying events taking place, the best two (2) are counted.

Should there be three (3) or less World Cup qualifying events taking place, paragraph F.1 from Olympic qualification System Paris 2024 TRA will apply: “the unused quota places will be allocated according to the Individual ranking results of the Qualifying Round (Q2) from the 2023 World Championships”.

For the Olympic Qualification, a separate Olympic Qualification Ranking list based on World Cup points will be established (see [Article 16 TRA World Cup Rules](#)).

The gymnast with the highest number of points, taking into consideration the best results achieved in two of the five World Cup qualifying events (maximum two, regardless of the number of competitions the gymnast participated in), will have the opportunity to earn a quota place for their NOC to participate in the 2024 Olympic Games.

The assignment of World Cup points for each counting competition will be the base to establish the Olympic Games Qualification Ranking list. This ranking list will be updated at the FIG website within 48 hours after the end of the respective competitions. This ranking list will be definitive after the last of the five-counting competitions of the 2023 and 2024 World Cup Series.

A gymnast, who earned a quota place at the 2023 World Championships for his/her NOC, may participate in the World Cup qualifying events but may **NOT** obtain an additional quota place for his/her NOC through the Individual World Cup Series. Gymnasts qualified through Criteria 1 will **NOT** be included in the Olympic Games Qualification Ranking list.

World Cup points earned by gymnasts qualified through Criteria 1 will **NOT** be reallocated in the Olympic Games Qualification Ranking list.

Qualification Places:

The highest ranked male and female gymnasts based on the Olympic Games Qualification ranking list will earn a quota place for their NOC with a maximum of one (1) per NOC provided their NOC have not qualified one quota place through Criteria 1.

Only the top three gymnasts of the Olympic Games Qualification Ranking list may qualify a second quota place for their NOC:

- If two gymnasts of the same NOC are ranked in the top three positions of the Olympic Games Qualification Ranking list, then only two NOC will qualify a second quota place for their NOCs.
- If three gymnasts of the same NOC are ranked in the top three positions of the Olympic Games Qualification Ranking list, then only that NOC will qualify a second quota place.

The best gymnasts up to the last eligible quota place will earn quota places for their NOCs (max. one per NOC). In case of tie, the following rules will apply:

- If there is a tie at the last possible quota place, the sum of the gymnasts' placements in the two counting competitions will be added together, and the gymnast with the lowest sum of placements will prevail.

Gymnast A would prevail with 20 (lowest sum of placements).

- If there is still a tie, the gymnast who has participated in the greater number of Finals of the two counting competitions will prevail.
- If there is still a tie, the gymnast with the best placement across the two counting competitions will prevail.
- If there is still a tie, the gymnast with the highest score obtained in one of the two counting competitions will prevail.

CANDIDATURES, APPLICATIONS AND ASSIGNMENT FOR OG QUALIFYING EVENT

These FIG World Cup competitions are best events, staged in attractive and well-known cities and venues, with guaranteed TV coverage and a limited participation. Their aim is to showcase the Worlds very best federations and gymnasts in a media and public friendly surrounding. The events will take place in the same city and if possible, at the same date every year.

The following conditions will apply to host a World Cup qualifying event:

- The organizer must NOT hold other competitions at the same site and date as the World Cup qualifying event. No overlapping between World Cup qualifying events and any other event is accepted.
- A venue with capacity of minimum 2000 seats.
- A training hall, adjacent or nearby the competition hall, large enough to place 4 trampolines.

Assignment of FIG World Cup competitions by the FIG Executive Committee

After consulting TRA-TC, preference will be given for leading tournaments as follows:

- organizers who offer a competition every year
- previous FIG World Cup Organizers
- the highest media impact (quality of the Host Broadcaster and worldwide sales)
- the highest prize money and other advantages provided to the gymnasts and participating member federations
- experienced and reliable Organizing Member Federations and Organizing Committees
- traditional and worldwide established tournaments
- attractive and large venues, located in famous leading cities of the world
- television coverage
- venue capacity.

COMPETITION FORMAT, PARTICIPATION AND PROGRAMME

The Organising Member Federation must offer competitions for Trampoline Individual Men and Women (IND) and Trampoline Synchro Men and Women (SYN) and may combine these with Tumbling Individual Men and Women (TUM) and/or Double Mini-Trampoline Men and Women (DMT).

The FIG World Cup qualifying events consist of the following:

- Qualifications (Q1 and Q2) and Finals in IND and SYN Competition Programme

The Organising Federation has to respect the following format and programme:

Competition and training schedules must be approved by the FIG Technical Committee President.

JUDGES' PANELS AND FIG TECHNICAL DELEGATES

Technical Delegate

The FIG TRA-TC will act as Superior Jury. Superior Jury is composed by the President of the Superior Jury, two SJ-E and 1 D-SJ per panel. If needed, the TRA-TC President could nominate Cat.1 judges to act as Superior Jury.

Judges' panels are set up by a draw -directed by the FIG Technical Delegate- from the judges present at the event. Priority will be given to the judges of the highest categories.

No panel may include more than one member from a single federation.

- The Chair of Judges Panel must be of Cat. 1.
- The Difficulty judges must be of Cat. 1 or 2.
- The Execution judges must be of Cat. 1, 2 or 3.

Each participating Federation must provide minimum one judge in each discipline in which they have competitors. Failure to do so, or if a participating Federation sends a judge with Category 4 (instead of Category 1, 2 or 3), will result in a fine of Swiss Francs 2'000.- to be paid to the organizing member federation. This provision must be mentioned in the invitation letter.

Time of Flight and Horizontal Displacement measuring device is mandatory.

Results

The LOC is responsible that the results of the competition, signed by the FIG Technical Delegate, are sent by e-mail to the FIG Office immediately after the end of the respective competitions.

The results and the updated Olympic Games qualifying Ranking List will be published on the FIG website within 48 hours after the end of the respective competitions.
