

**World Cup qualifying events process
and ranking
OG 2028 Trampoline**

May 2026

ART. 1 GENERAL PRINCIPLES

The 2027 and 2028 Trampoline & Tumbling World Cup Series will be qualifying for the 2028 Olympic Games only for Individual Trampoline competitors. This document should be read in conjunction with FIG Technical Regulations, [Olympic Qualification System Los Angeles 2028 TRA](#), and FIG TRA World Cup Rules.

Six (6) World Cup competitions will be held through this period, according to the following distribution:

Three (3) World Cup qualifying events competition in 2027 (May – mid October)

Three (3) World Cup qualifying events competition in 2028 (February – April)

The three (3) best results out of the six (6) events will be taken into consideration, regardless the number of competitions the gymnasts participated in. For each gymnast, a maximum of two (2) World Cup qualifying events in 2027 will be taken into consideration.

Should there be only 5 or 4 World Cup qualifying events taking place, the best 3 are counted.

Should there be 3 or less World Cup qualifying events taking place, paragraph F.1 from Olympic qualification System Los Angeles 2028 TRA will apply: “the unused quota places will be allocated according to the Individual ranking results of the Qualifying Round (Q2) (or Q1 if gymnasts did not compete in Q2) at the 2027 World Championships”.

For the Olympic Qualification, a separate Olympic Qualification Ranking list based on World Cup points will be published after each qualifying World Cup (see [Article 16 TRA World Cup Rules](#)).

The gymnast with the highest number of points, taking into consideration the best results achieved in World Cup qualifying events (maximum three, regardless of the number of competitions the gymnast participated in), will have the opportunity to earn a quota place for their NOC to participate in the 2028 Olympic Games.

The assignment of World Cup points for each counting competition will be the basis to establish the Olympic Games Qualification Ranking list. This ranking list will be updated on the WGYM website within 48 hours after the end of the respective competitions. This ranking list will be definitive after the last counting competition of the 2027 and 2028 World Cup Series.

A gymnast who earned a quota place at the 2027 World Championships for his/her NOC (Criteria 1) may participate in the World Cup qualifying events but **CANNOT** obtain an additional quota place for his/her NOC through the Individual World Cup Series. Gymnasts qualified through Criteria 1 will **NOT** be included in the Olympic Games Qualification Ranking list.

World Cup points earned by gymnasts qualified through Criteria 1 will **NOT** be reallocated in the Olympic Games Qualification Ranking list.

Qualification Places:

The highest ranked male and female gymnasts based on the Olympic Games Qualification ranking list will earn a quota place for their NOC with a maximum of one (1) per NOC provided their NOC have not qualified one quota place through Criteria 1.

Only the top three gymnasts of the Olympic Games Qualification Ranking list may qualify a second quota place for their NOC:

- If two gymnasts of the same NOC are ranked in the top three positions of the Olympic Games Qualification Ranking list, then only two NOC will qualify a second quota place for their NOCs.
- If three gymnasts of the same NOC are ranked in the top three positions of the Olympic Games Qualification Ranking list, then only that NOC will qualify a second quota place.

The best gymnasts up to the last eligible quota place will earn quota places for their NOCs (max. one per NOC). In case of tie, the following rules will apply:

- o If there is a tie at the last possible quota place, the sum of the gymnasts' placements in the three counting competitions will be added together, and the gymnast with the lowest sum of placements will prevail.

Gymnast A would prevail with 33 (lowest sum of placements).

- o If there is still a tie, the gymnast who has participated in the greater number of Finals of the three counting competitions will prevail.
- o If there is still a tie, the gymnast with the best placement across the three counting competitions will prevail.
- o If there is still a tie, the gymnast with the best placement in 2027 World Championships will prevail.

CANDIDATURES, APPLICATIONS AND ASSIGNMENT FOR OG QUALIFYING EVENT

These World Cup competitions are best events, staged in attractive and well-known cities and venues, with guaranteed TV coverage and a limited participation. Their aim is to showcase the World's best gymnasts in a media and public friendly surrounding.

By 30 June 2026, National Federations are invited to bid to organize a World Cup qualifying event in either 2027 or 2028.

The following conditions must apply to host a World Cup qualifying event:

The organizer must NOT hold other competitions at the same site and date as the World Cup qualifying event. No overlapping between World Cup qualifying events and any other event is accepted.

A venue with capacity of minimum 2000 seats.

A training hall, adjacent or nearby the competition hall, large enough to place 4 trampolines surrounded by a safety perimeter according to FIG Apparatus Norms. A detailed map of the venue must be included in the application bid.

Assignment of World Cup events by the Executive Committee

By July 2026, the EC will approve a) the composition of the 2027 World Cup Series, b) the three World Cup qualifying events in 2027, and c) if the conditions are met, the World Cup qualifying events in 2028.

Whenever possible, only one World Cup qualifying event will be allocated per NF. Preference will be given to host qualifying events in six different NFs.

After consulting T&T-TC, preference will be given for leading tournaments as follows:

organizers who offer a competition every year

previous World Cup Organizers

the highest media impact (quality of the Host Broadcaster and worldwide sales)

the highest prize money and other advantages provided to the gymnasts and participating member federations

experienced and reliable Organizing Member Federations and Organizing Committees

traditional and worldwide established tournaments

attractive and large venues, located in famous leading cities of the world

television coverage

venue capacity.

COMPETITION FORMAT, PARTICIPATION AND PROGRAMME

World Cup events included in the Olympic Games qualification programme must be organised during three (3) competition days, preferably on Friday, Saturday and Sunday.

The Organising Member Federation must offer competitions for Individual Trampoline (Men and Women) and Synchro Trampoline (Men, Women and Mixed).

Additionally, competitions in Individual Tumbling (Men and Women) and/or in Individual Double Mini-Trampoline (Men and Women) are accepted.

The WGYM World Cup qualifying events consist, at least, of the following:

Qualifications (Q1 and Q2) and Finals in IND and SYN Competition Programme

All IND TRA Finals must be held during the last competition day.

Competition and training schedules must be approved by the TRA Technical Committee President. The LOC must send their initial schedule proposal together with their bid.

JUDGES' PANELS AND WGYM TECHNICAL DELEGATES

Technical Delegate

The TRA TC will act as Superior Jury. Superior Jury is composed by the President of the Superior Jury, two SJ-E and one SJ-D per panel. If needed, the T&T-TC President could nominate Cat.1 judges to act as Superior Jury.

Judges' panels are set up by a draw -directed by the TRA Technical Delegate- from the judges present at the event. Priority will be given to the judges of the highest categories.

No panel may include more than one member from a single federation.

The Chair of Judges Panel must be of Cat. 1.

The Difficulty judges must be of Cat. 1 or 2.

The Execution judges must be of Cat. 1, 2 or 3. In IND TRA events, priority will be given to E-judges of Cat. 1 or 2.

Each participating Federation must provide minimum one judge in each discipline in which they have competitors. Failure to do so, or if a participating Federation sends a judge with Category 4 (instead of Category 1, 2 or 3), will result in a fine of Swiss Francs 2'000.- to be paid to the organizing member federation. This provision must be mentioned in the invitation letter.

Results

The LOC is responsible that the results of the competition, signed by the TRA Technical Delegate, are sent by e-mail to the FIG Office immediately after the end of the respective competitions.


The results and the updated Olympic Games qualifying Ranking List will be published on the FIG website within 48 hours after the end of the respective competitions.
