# **2022-2024 FIG JUDGES' RULES**



## **SPECIFIC RULES FOR WOMEN'S ARTISTIC GYMNASTICS**

Version 3.1 – REVISED in March 2022

The FIG has approved the 2022-2024 FIG General Judges' Rules which are applicable to all competitive disciplines. The specific rules and clarifications listed below apply only to Women's Artistic Gymnastics and are in compliance with the General Judges' Rules.

## ARTICLE 1 JUDGES' COURSES

In 2022, by passing an online test and without any additional experience requirements:

- certified judges in the XIV Cycle may confirm their Category for the XV Cycle
- new judges may obtain FIG international brevet for the XV Cycle (maximum Category 4)

Depending on the pandemic situation, Regional courses may be held in presence later in the cycle to allow current judges to upgrade their brevet up to cat. 2 or to allow new judges to certify. More information about the Testing evaluation scale valid at Regional courses will be released later in the 2022 and added to this Specific Judges' Rules.

The judging test will include a video practical testing on the Code of Points.

## ARTICLE 2 TESTING

This Summary of Evaluation Methods for the online test is confirmed by the WTC after completion of the online tests.

### 2.1.1 Practical D-jury

15 Exercises (5 per apparatus) 10 Vaults	Maximum = 100%
Candidates will list Element Values (DV), Compositional Requirements (CR) total, and Connection Value (CV) & Bonus (Including DMT Bonus) total. Vault: candidates will recognise the DV.	The final score will be the average percentage from all exercises.
The calculation of D score for each routine consists of the following steps: 1. Determine the number of mistakes in the judge's D score 2. Assign percentage based on the number of mistakes.	
Candidates will lose 10% for each incorrect Element Value (DV) number in an exercise. Composition Requirement (CR) will lose 10% for each 0.5 deviation and Connection Value (CV) & Bonus will lose 10% for each 0.1 deviation. Vault: Candidates will lose 10% for each incorrect DV, regardless of the deviation.	

Maximum time for evaluation and listing of required components of D jury is 120 seconds (Vault 40 sec.)

## 2.1.2 Practical E-jury

20 exercises (5 per apparatus)	Maximum = 100%
Scores are based on a calculation program using the table below. To determine the candidate, score for an exercise, look for the specific Expert Deductions row then follow the row to locate the Difference from Expert Deductions for the final percentage awarded for the exercise.	The final score will be the average percentage from all exercises.

Maximum time for evaluation of E jury is:

- 60 seconds for UB
- 70 seconds for Beam and Floor
- 40 seconds for Vault.

## 2.2 Testing Evaluation Scale

The percentage score required for passing the online test is fixed by the Technical Committee at the conclusion of the online tests

Fail	74.99% & below

## ARTICLE 3 CATEGORY 1 JUDGES

### 3.1 Category 1 Judges – qualification

The current judges (excluding TC members) from the list of cat.1 judges maintain their category by passing the online test.

### 3.2 Category 1 Judges' Draw

For World Championships: Category 1 judges will be drawn by NF first, and, then drawn by name, for the D positions. The judges of the respective NF cannot be taken into consideration during the cycle, until all the NFs have been drawn.

## **ARTICLE 4 THE JUDGES' NOMINATION, SELECTION AND DRAW**

The judges' nomination, selection and draw procedure is based on the principles in the Technical Regulations.

The Difficulty and Execution judges in the panel must be from different NFs.

In Team Final and Apparatus Finals the Execution judges must be "neutral".

If a NF rejects the draw/nomination as D Judge, this judge may not be selected to another position for the same competition. In the case of the Olympic Games and Youth Olympic Games, no other position will be assigned to another judge from this NF.

The E-jury draw for Apparatus Finals at Senior and Junior World Championships will be conducted by giving priority to Cat. 1 and Cat. 2 judges.

## **ARTICLE 6 FINAL PROVISIONS**

The principles of the FIG General Judges' Rules have been approved by the Executive Committee.

These 2022 – 2024 FIG Specific Judges' Rules for Women Artistic Gymnastics have been approved by the Executive Committee at its meeting in December 2021 and they have been revised in March 2022. They enter into effect on January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022.
